# From the President

**The coming season is about the Fremantle Football Club taking the next step. It is a step that we all want to take and it is one that we have to take.**

**SOME EXPECTED** that to have already occurred, especially after our 2006 season. There were high expectations on us from those outside our club expecting that our Preliminary Final appearance of 2006 to automatically translate into much more this year. While our off-field performance continues to see our club as one of the strongest with a fifth consecutive record membership and a record number of sponsors and corporate partners, our on field performance did not deliver what we expected. The year started and continued to deliver setbacks and disappointments, whether that was with player unavailability or through our inability to deliver wins when we were positioned to do so at various stages of games. One of those challenges we faced of course was the departure of Chris Connolly as Senior Coach and Mark Harvey taking charge in such fine style for the remaining seven games of the season.

Despite what was thrown our way we continued to battle out the season. We have seen players develop their careers further with the club, five of our young players made their AFL debuts and acquitted themselves well as they took the first steps of their careers and our established players reached memorable career milestones. Shaun McManus played his 200th AFL game and Paul Hasleby, James Walker, Peter Bell and Troy Cook played their 150th games for the club earning Life Membership.

We also said farewell to two retiring loyal servants, Shane Parker and Troy Cook, who gave our club everything they could and played with a passion that has inspired many a young player and excited the fans.

Matthew Pavlich, in his first year as Captain, led the team tremendously well with another outstanding season and was rewarded with his fourth Doig Medal and his fifth All Australian selection.

We are now very much focused on taking the important next step with our on-field performances. I firmly believe that we have the coaching team, administration and playing group to deliver our objective of establishing ourselves as consistent finals participants. The changes we have made leading into 2008 confirm that we are clearly and firmly committed to achieving that objective.

The competition must be respected as other teams will be seeking to do similar to us. However, with the commitment of our dedicated staff, coaches and players, the opportunity is before us and I look forward to being able to refer to our season in the not too distant future as *annus mirabilis*, year of wonders.

# From the Senior Coach

**HEADING INTO** round 16 this year I was asked to step into the role of Senior Coach for the remaining seven weeks of the season. For all I have experienced in my 23 years in the AFL as a player and coach, it would be fair to say that what I was about to experience at that time, the pressures and responsibilities of Senior Coach, would be something that I had never sampled before.

The response of the players and coaches for that round 16 match in Adelaide was tremendous under what were difficult circumstances for everyone and the support I received from the staff, players, members and supporters at that time was fantastic. It was pleasing in 2007 that we had the opportunity to see many of our younger players make a contribution during the course of the year, some adding to their current games tallies while others made their AFL debuts. We played 40 players in 2007, the most in any one season since our debut year in 1995. We also saw players take on more responsibility or play in roles that they would otherwise not have played. All that placing us well as we move forward.



# 2007 Doig Medal

## DOIG MEDALLIST

### Matthew Pavlich

**In his first year as Club Captain, Matthew Pavlich led from the front to claim his fourth Doig Medal as the club's best and fairest in season in 2007.**

**THE RECORD-MAKING** win in this year's Doig Medal capped off another outstanding year that saw Matthew earn his fifth All Australian selection after dominating up forward, booting a club season record 72 goals at an average of 3.4 per game. His 300th career goal came in round 19 against Essendon. His 22 games in 2007 continued his consecutive games streak to 144, having not missed a game since round 15, 2001, and took his career tally to 175 games.

This season Matthew led the AFL in marks with 203 at an average of 9.2 per game and collected 381 disposals at an average of 17.3 per game. His impressive season also saw him named Captain of the SANFL's honorary 2007 State of Origin team.

The 2007 Doig Medal win, his third in succession, follows his wins in 2002, 2005 and 2006 and makes Matthew the record holder for most Doig Medals having shared the record previously with Peter Bell who won in 2001, 2003 and 2004. Matthew was runner-up in 2003 and finished in third place in 2004. The captain sealed the season by committing to the club for another three seasons.

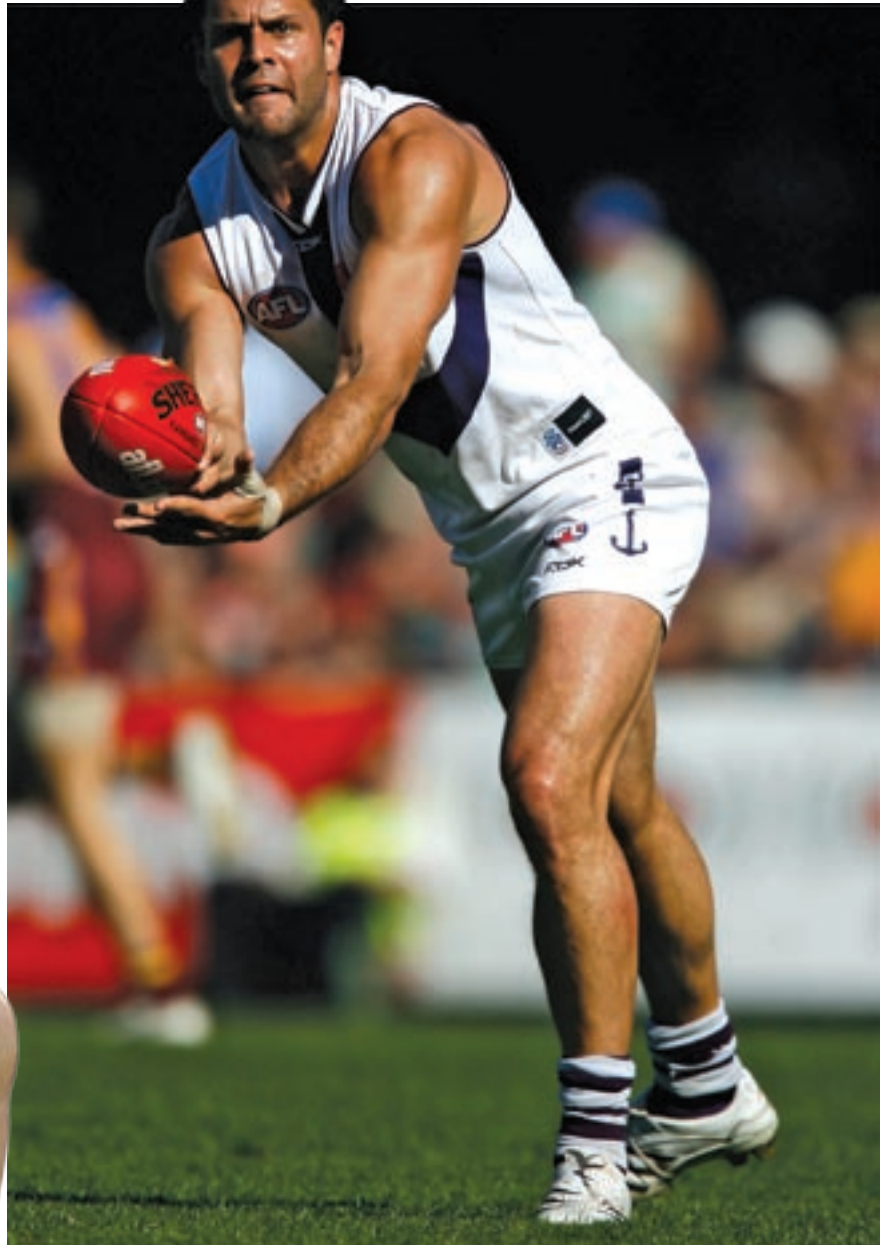
## RUNNER UP

### Antoni Grover

**DEFENDER ANTONI GROVER** was rewarded for his outstanding and arguably his best season receiving his first top three finish in the Doig Medal as runner-up to Matthew Pavlich. Reflecting a consistent year in the club's defence, this year he averaged 13.5 possessions and 4.6 marks per game. He failed to poll a vote in only six of his 21 games this season.

Regularly handed the job of containing some of the league's most damaging forwards, Antoni stamped his authority as one of the competition's most effective shut down defenders in 2007 and was rewarded for his endeavours with his first selection in the WA State of Origin team.

Promoted from the club's Rookie List, Antoni made his AFL debut in round 21 1999 against Sydney at the WACA Ground. He has gone on to play 129 games for the club.



## THIRD PLACE

### Luke McPharlin

**JOINING FELLOW DEFENDER** and Doig Medal runner-up Antoni Grover as key figures in Fremantle's backline throughout the season, fullback Luke McPharlin also claimed his first top three finish in the Doig Medal for 2007 with 22 votes.

Luke played 21 games in season 2007 to take his tally to 101 games for Fremantle and 113 AFL games in total.

He averaged 14.1 disposals and 7.2 marks per game and despite playing most of the season at fullback, he again showed his versatility when moved forward in the round 21 match against Melbourne, his 100th game for Fremantle, kicking 5 goals to take his career tally to 68. He earned his third WA State of Origin selection in 2007.

## EQUAL FOURTH PLACE



### Dean Solomon

**IN HIS FIRST** year for the club, Dean showed what an asset he is by leading the season's tackle count with 108 tackles and earning more free kicks than any other Fremantle player (33).

Dean averaged more than 15 disposals a game and finished the season with 46 hard ball gets. He was a vital addition up forward with 11 goals and ranked second at the club with 23 goal assists.



### Peter Bell

**FORMER CAPTAIN** Peter Bell had another outstanding season. He played all 22 games, averaged 22 possessions per game, and showed why he is one of the premier players in the AFL.

Peter earned his sixth consecutive State of Origin selection, earned AFL Life Membership and Fremantle Football Club Life Membership this year. He is a three time Doig Medal winner and three time runner-up.

### Roger Hayden

**THE SMOOTH STYLE** of Roger running from defence was a highlight of the season and was recognised nationally as he earned his first squad nomination for All Australian selection.

Roger played all 22 games this season and was rewarded for a great year with his first State of Origin selection. He led the club with 68 rebound 50s.



### Heath Black

**THE BEST** Clubman award is presented to a person that has made an outstanding contribution to the club both on and off the field.

Heath's total commitment to his preparation and on field performances were matched by his work around the club. He readily made himself available to represent the club at various functions whilst maintaining his high game preparation standards. Heath worked closely with and assisted the team's younger players in a mentoring role. He is a worthy winner of the 2007 Best Clubman Award.



### Josh Carr

**2007 WAS YET** another outstanding season for the vice captain, averaging 21 disposals and four tackles per game and kicking 14 goals for the season.

Josh had 138 contested possessions, 51 hard ball gets, 59 loose ball gets and 79 season tackles. Another not to take a backward step on the field, he earned his second State of Origin selection in 2007.

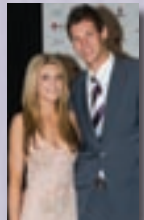
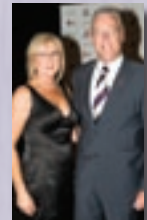
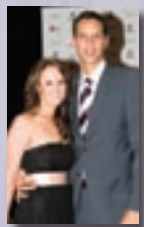
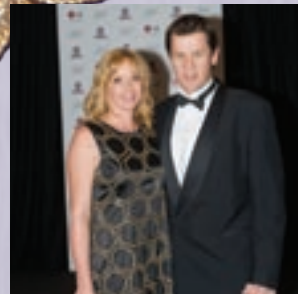
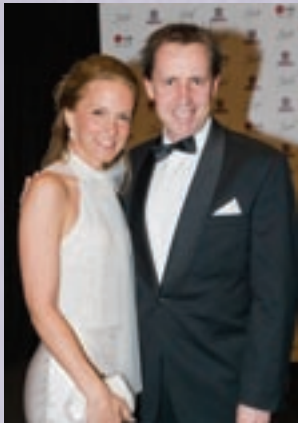
## BEACON AWARD

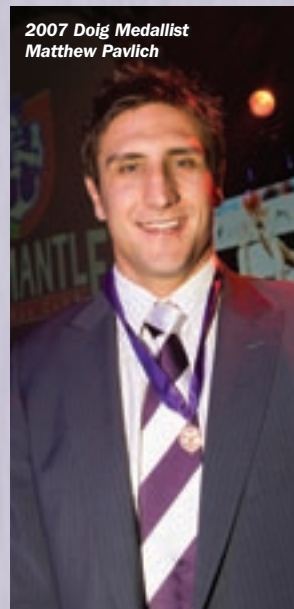

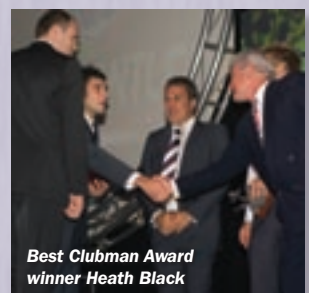
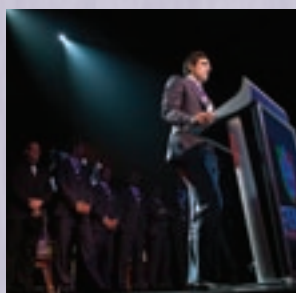

# Chief Executive Officer's Report

**As Chief Executive Officer, I am pleased to report that your club continued to establish itself as one of the AFL's strongest in 2007. All key off field indicators showed that Fremantle now enjoys very high levels of support and brand strength in the national competition.**

**THIS YEAR** we will report our fourth consecutive one-million-dollar-plus profit and we expect at least a similar result in 2008. We exceeded \$30 million gross revenue for the first time in our history and each of the club's operational divisions met, or exceeded, its strategic priorities. Our new Strategic Plan for the period from 2008 to 2010 sets even higher standards and targets.

We continued to enjoy tremendous support at all levels in 2007. We set our fifth consecutive record membership, our corporate support through game day hospitality, signage and events also set record levels and the club's sponsorship revenues were also at their highest level.

Our Community Goal initiatives and Community Development Programme continue to set new benchmarks and this will be expanded further in 2008.

However, despite these outstanding achievements in the club's off-field operations, there is no hiding from the disappointment we all felt with our on-field performance in season 2007. The simple fact that we failed to make the finals was not acceptable.

Our football operations were thoroughly reviewed at season's end and we have acted decisively and made a number of critical changes. The most important of course was the appointment of Mark Harvey as Senior Coach. Mark and his highly credentialed support team will lead us into next season in a positive and determined manner.

We have also added exciting young talent in Rhys Palmer, Clayton Hinkley, Chris Mayne and the experienced Mark Johnson and

Kepler Bradley to our playing list through the National Draft and our pre-season and development programmes are also well advanced.

It is my belief that we have assembled an outstanding team of hard working and talented staff across the whole organisation who deserve full recognition for their roles in developing the club to its current high standing in this tough competition. I am very proud of our staff, who should be equally proud of what they have achieved over the last six or so years.

I would like to once again acknowledge the contributions of the Senior Management team in 2007 – Gary Walton (Chief Operating Officer), Keith Black (General Manager – Corporate and Community Affairs), Steve Rosich (General Manager – Commercial Operations), Darren Beazley (General Manager – Strategic Partnerships) and Robert Shaw (General Manager – Football Operations). The off-season has seen the Senior Management Team broadened with the recent appointments of Chris Bond in the role of General Manager – List Development and James Begley as General Manager – Leadership and Development.

Thank you to all our sponsors, corporate partners and members for your fantastic support in 2007. At Fremantle we enjoy a level of support that is very passionate and we appreciate your loyalty and commitment to what we are all setting out to achieve together.

## FOOTBALL

**OUR ON-FIELD** performances in 2007 were disappointing. Simply, we did not achieve the expected high level of performance. While external expectations were high, within the club we knew that we still had room to improve.

From the outset, we were chasing wins.

The team was never settled with key player availability affected by suspension and injury. Most notably we missed Justin Longmuir for 20 games, Jeff Farmer for 14 games, Byron Schammer and Brett Peake for 12 games, Shane Parker for 8 games, Aaron Sandilands for 7 games, Steven Dodd for six games, Heath Black for 5 games and Michael Johnson missed 4 games. Such blocks of absences of key players impact on any squad and certainly impacted our club over the course of the season.

A total of 40 players took the field this year, the highest number since our inaugural year in 1995. Robert Warnock, Clayton Collard, Garrick Ibbotson, Andrew Foster and Brock O'Brien made their AFL debuts. Peter Bell, James Walker, Troy Cook and Paul Hasleby played their 150th games for the club, achieving Life Membership. Others to achieve milestones during the course of 2007 were Shaun McManus, 200 games for the club, Matthew Carr 150 AFL games, Luke McPharlin 100 AFL games and 100 club games, and Josh Carr, Steven Dodd, David Mundy, Scott Thornton, Michael

Johnson and Ryan Crowley all played their 50th games for the club. Peter Bell played his 300th official AFL game earning AFL Life Membership.

It was also a season that we farewelled two players who gave their all for our club. Games record holder Shane Parker and Troy Cook departed the game and should be congratulated for the outstanding way they represented the club over such long careers. The way they played the game and their contributions to Fremantle cannot be underestimated.

Captain Matthew Pavlich, in his first year as skipper, led the team admirably. In an outstanding season, he set a new club season goal scoring record, a club record for most marks in a season, was selected for his fifth All Australian honour and won his fourth Doig Medal. In the latter part of the season, Matthew showed his continued loyalty by committing to the club for a further three years.

While Matthew Pavlich claimed his record fourth Doig Medal, Antoni Grover capped off a strong season earning his first runner-up medal, with Luke McPharlin also winning his first medal in third place.

Peter Bell, Luke McPharlin, Aaron Sandilands, Michael Johnson, Josh Carr, Roger Hayden and Antoni Grover all earned selection in the WA State of Origin Team. For Roger Hayden and Antoni Grover this was their first state honour while for Peter

Bell it was his sixth. He has been selected in every WA State of Origin Team since 2002, three times as captain and once as vice-captain.

Despite our experienced list, our long term management and development of the club's playing list will be a key focus going forward. We need to ensure that our recruitment and selection processes provide the best opportunity for the club to attract the very best talent possible.

Former club captain Chris Bond has joined as General Manager – List Development and will have a key objective of building the club's recruiting operations at all levels to ensure the long term quality of the club's playing list. Chris will also be a key member of the coaching team as the opposition coach.

We selected some terrific talent at this year's AFL National Draft to add to what is an experienced and stable player group. Our first three picks saw us inject some quality, young players in Rhys Palmer, Clayton Hinkley and Chris Mayne into our squad, as part of our future planning.

We have also spent the last few years building on the experience within the player group through the annual trade period and despite our inactivity during this year's trade, the draft saw us welcome premiership player Mark Johnson and local talent Kepler Bradley to the club. Together they bring almost 250 games of experience to the list.

Over the past two seasons we have also invested heavily into our strength and conditioning areas and our technology systems. These investments were critical for our club to reach the standards set by the strongest clubs in the competition and were investments that could only be achieved due to our strong financial position. Season 2008 is about developing the playing group to achieve sustained, consistent performances.

Another key focus in 2008 will be the development of our player group. The club has appointed James Begley as General Manager – Leadership and Development and he will be working closely with the coaches, player group, board and staff to develop our club values and behaviours, at both an individual level, as well as on a whole-of-club level.

We have never faltered from our plan to build the organisation at all levels, in particular our football department, with a view to consistently play finals football, and at all times with a Premiership focus. We will continue to develop and invest to give the club the best opportunity to achieve that goal in what is arguably the most even sporting competition in the world.

The biggest challenge we faced in season 2007 was the departure of Chris Connolly. When he joined the club in 2002 as Senior Coach, there was a great challenge before Chris to build a competitive team, while at the same time, market our brand wide and far.

Chris Connolly's contribution to get Fremantle cannot be underestimated. During his time as our Senior Coach, he built up a strong playing list, as well as significantly developing the players. Under his leadership, we played in our first final in 2003 and won our historical first final in 2006. He also gave tirelessly to our members, sponsors and corporate partners

giving above and beyond what was required as a Senior Coach.

In a typical demonstration of Chris Connolly putting the club ahead of his own personal desires or ambitions, he stepped down as our Senior Coach after round 15 this year. As he said at the time, it was necessary to "lift the dark cloud hanging over the club". It presented the club with another major challenge with seven rounds remaining in the season.

Mark Harvey stepped in as Senior Coach for the remaining seven games of the home and away season. He showed that he was ready to assume the role on a full time basis after he led the team to four wins.

The appointment of Mark as Senior Coach at season's end also brought about other changes to the football department. We enter next season with a bolstered coaching team with Assistant Coach Peter German and Player Development Coach Steve Malaxos joined by dual Essendon premiership player and Assistant Coach Dean Wallis, dual Brisbane premiership player Chris Scott and former Essendon and West Coast player Michael Prior as Skills Coach. Chris Bond will complete the new look coaching ensemble as the Oppositions Coach.

Our coaching team for 2008 is experienced, understanding what it takes to be successful with eight premierships between them as players and coaches and a total 1,061 AFL games as players.

At the end of the season we farewelled Assistant Coaches Kelly O'Donnell and Michael Broadbridge, with Kelly joining his old club Melbourne as Player Development Coach and Michael joined West Coast as Skills Coach. Kelly built tremendous respect during his time at the club and his contribution should not be underestimated. The club would like to thank both Kelly and Michael for their valued contribution to our club.

We have selected some terrific young talent at this year's AFL National Draft with Rhys Palmer joining us with our first selection from East Fremantle (number seven overall), Clayton Hinkley with our second selection from North Ballart (selection 24 overall) and Chris Maine joining us from Perth with our third selection (number 40 selection overall). We also added Mark Johnson and Kepler Bradley to our playing list from Essendon. Mark is a proven player in the competition with 194 AFL games, premierships success in 2000 and a best and fairest medal with Essendon to his credit. Kepler Bradley was taken at selection 6 in the 2003 National Draft and has played 49 games with Essendon. We have added three talented and exciting young players along with some valuable AFL experience to our playing list through the 2007 National Draft.

This year we were also saddened by the passing of club Vice Patron Con Regan in April. Con had been a key part of our club since the very beginning when he assumed the role as the inaugural team manager. A legend of the Fremantle Football Club, Con was passionate about his football, his community and Fremantle. We had the opportunity to acknowledge Con at the round 5 match against Adelaide and in his memory the club struck a medal in his honour, the Con Regan Award. It was determined that the award would be presented to an individual who had made a significant contribution to the club.

At this year's Doig Medal Presentation Dinner, I took great pleasure in presenting Con's wife Beryl with a medal and also to make the announcement and present the inaugural Con Regan Award to Chris Connolly for the tremendous work he had done in his six years at the club. It was a fitting recognition to Chris for the selfless work he had done to help get this club to where it is today.

## FINANCE

**OUR FINANCIAL** management continues to deliver strong results with the club achieving its fourth consecutive million-dollar-plus operating profit and our 2007/2008 budget will deliver a similar result next year. This year's operating result of approximately \$1.5 million is a record profit level for our club was achieved on a club record revenue level of \$30.8 million, a strong result accounting for investments the club has made in its

long term future in our technology systems this year and our coaching structures for the future as well as covering increased operational costs servicing increased membership and corporate activities. It should be noted that in 2007 Fremantle will make a royalty payment to the WAFC in the order of \$500,000 that will be paid from this operating result.

Our club continues to build its net tangible asset position in the absence of debt. The

building of our net tangible assets ensures that our club remains strongly positioned for the future to manage our own financial destiny and fund our own development. The net asset position stands now at \$2.69 million, an increase in our net tangible asset position of 60.8 per cent from last year.

This year the club has continued to improve the governance of the business with increased focus upon risk management and long term planning. We will continue to manage our club for the long term benefit and financial strength while ensuring that meeting our short term financial needs does not impact on these long term objectives. We remain committed to our strength of financial management, particularly the management of the costs of our operations.

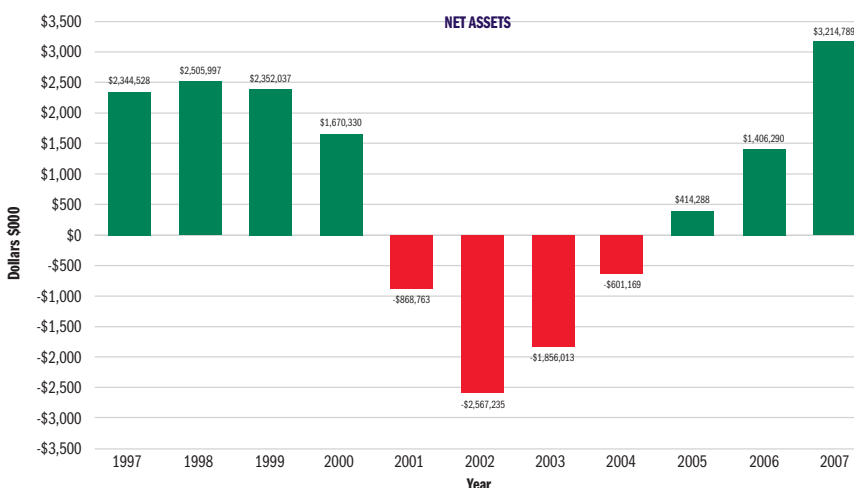
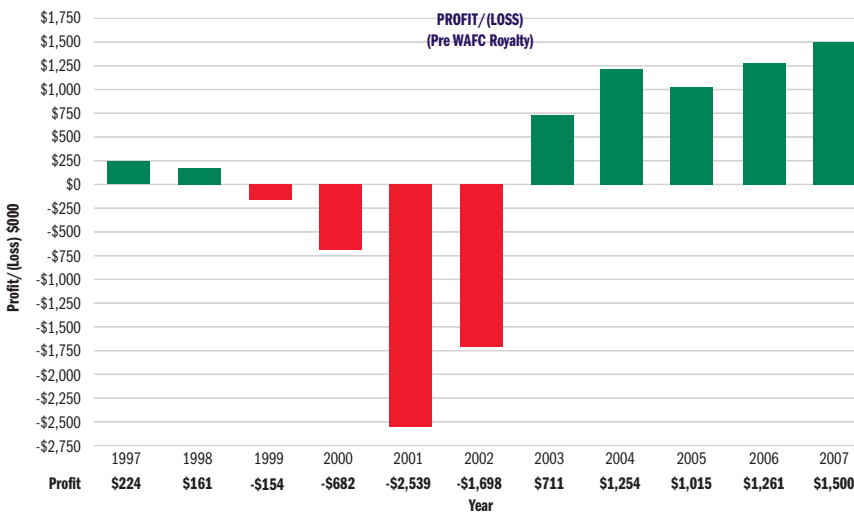
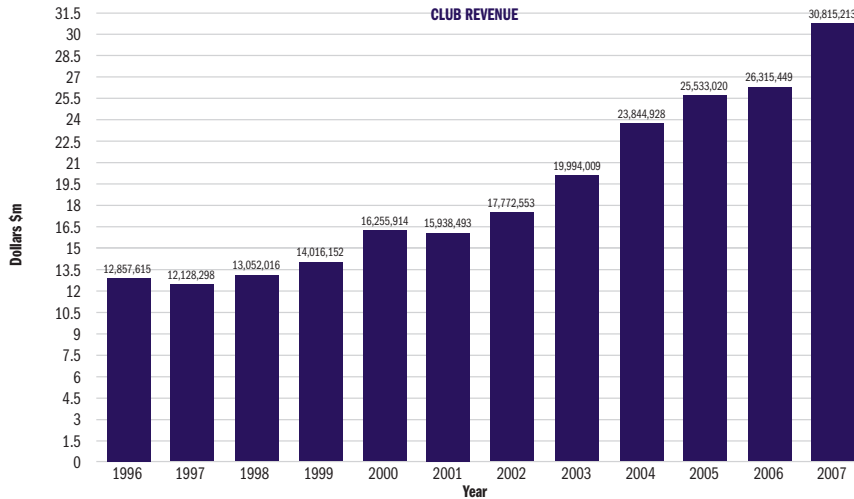

**THE CLUB'S** community activities kicked off with the annual AFL Community Camp, this year held in the Wheatbelt region. Based in Northam, the players and coaches visited more than 25 primary and secondary schools around the region from Northam to Merredin, from Toodyay to Goomalling, including Koorda, Cunderdin, Wundowie, Beverley and Calingiri. The annual camp is a fantastic opportunity for Fremantle to meet its members and supporters around the state and the support for the club in Wheatbelt region during this year's camp was exceptional.

The annual Community Camp is a major undertaking for the club each year and a valuable part of the club's Community Goals.



Community Goals represents your club's commitment to its very important role within the Western Australian community and represents a wide ranging set of initiatives, programmes and charitable associations. The aim of the Community Goals initiative is to assist the many and varied sections of our community. We will continue to develop and expand our programmes and initiatives within our community in 2008 and beyond.

Indeed, our club introduced many new key initiatives in 2007 with the 'Live The Dream' programme, proudly sponsored by Alinta, and *A Helping Hand*, proudly sponsored by BHP Billiton Iron Ore, both making their debuts in our range of community initiatives.



Proudly supported by Diamond Level sponsor Alinta, the 'Live The Dream' programme was designed to help the participants develop teamwork, leadership skills and problem solving skills. It also provided them with experiences that took them outside of their

comfort zone to develop skills that they could take back to their local community and pass onto their peers.

The inaugural 'Live The Dream' programme was given glowing reports from the twelve lucky participants who spent five days living the life of an AFL footballer in July.

The intensive programme saw each participant appointed a mentor from the Fremantle player group who guided and assisted them in one-on-one sessions during the five days. The player mentors were Byron Schammer, Ryley Dunn, Brett Peake, Ryan Crowley, David Mundy, Marcus Drum, Scott Thornton, Steven Dodd, Ryan Murphy, Aaron Sandilands, Michael Johnson and Roger Hayden.

The itinerary also included skills training, physical conditioning and injury prevention sessions with the club's strength and conditioning staff, interactive sessions on nutrition, media training, player welfare and recruitment information, senior team match day involvement and post game recovery sessions as well as a leadership and team building session with the Special Air Services (SAS) Regiment.

The lucky participants were selected from a large range of nominations received through either the Fremantle Football Club Youth League competition, through a club aligned charity (Redkite or Heart Foundation), through the Welcome to the AFL programme, or by entering in the special Alinta/92.9 'Live The Dream' promotion.



Proudly supported by BHP Billiton Iron Ore, *A Helping Hand* is a concept developed by the Swan Districts Football Club to assist with relocation of indigenous footballers from regional Western Australia to the City so that they may pursue a fulfilling football career with the Swans in the WAFL.

Fremantle was invited to become involved in the initiative, with four of the club's players assisting the Swans' country recruits. Troy Cook, Roger Hayden, Calib Mourish and Clayton Collard, who originate from Carnarvon, Brookton, Mullewa and the Peel Region respectively, worked with the players on their off-field development to maximise their chances for success on the field.

The programme covered topics such as team building, game preparation, education and employment and public speaking. *A Helping Hand* is another key initiative in which the club supports grass roots football in Western Australia and will return again in 2008.



This year represented the fourth year of operation of the club's Community Development Programme (CDP), a key programme of the club's Community Goals initiative. An independent research study commissioned by the club during the year and supported by the AFL highlighted that the club's CDP continues to be one of the most innovative programs in the AFL.

It was also a special year for the CDP with Alinta assuming sponsorship of the programme's many key initiatives, focusing on young Western Australians. The programme extends to children in the community through the Johnny 'The Doc' Docker Motor Skills Programme, the Freo Long Bomb and Freo Kwik Kick skills competitions, the AFL Experience Clinics, as well as the School of the Week and the Welcome to the AFL programmes.



The CDP's School Holiday Programme run in July proved popular again this year. Over 400 eager children enjoyed a great morning on Fremantle Oval learning skills from some of their AFL heroes during an interactive football clinic. The inaugural Johnny 'The Doc' Docker Motor Skills Gala Day held in June was a huge success attracting more than 500 pre-primary students for a fun filled day of learning with the playing group.

The Welcome to the AFL programme was a new addition to the CDP this year. This fantastic new initiative is designed to attract and engage new participants into Australian football and the Fremantle Football Club, with specific objectives being to introduce culturally and linguistically diverse populations as well as female participants to sport. In its first year, the Welcome to the AFL programme was an overwhelming success with all programmes fully booked for the year and a strong demand for more programmes in 2008.

Alinta's commitment to supporting our community and giving back to the local

community is reflected with their support of the CDP which enabled the club to enhance and increase the level of programmes, as well as deliver the initiatives to more school aged children across the Western Australia. We thank Alinta for their support of the CDP in 2007 and in the coming years.

#### Aligned Charities

The club's aligned charities this year were Redkite and the Heart Foundation of WA, who were chosen from an exceptional field of organisations to become the charity partners for seasons 2007 and 2008. Both charities have enjoyed a fruitful first year into the partnership which aims to increase awareness of their work within the community.

Redkite support children through cancer and offer a range of services to those being treated for cancer and their families, including emotional, financial, educational, and bereavement support, as well as music therapy.



To kick off the partnership, ten year old cancer survivor and passionate Fremantle fan Jesse Trigwell was chosen as the club's Number One Junior Ticket Holder and he and his family enjoyed season tickets to the footy!

Ryan Crowley and Michael Johnson took on the role as Redkite Ambassadors and were involved in the Redkite Karaoke Day on ward 3B at Princess Margaret Hospital, as well as visiting visit the children on the oncology ward at the hospital throughout the year. They also attended the Redkite Family Movie Day, and united the club's brains trust for the Redkite Corporate Quiz in October.

The Heart Foundation is Australia's leading heart health charity in the fight against heart, stroke and blood vessel disease (cardiovascular disease).



The partnership has seen Fremantle involved with the Go Red for Women Day aimed at raising vital funds for research and education into women and heart disease, the Keeping Ahead of the Pack resource, produced by

the Smarter than Smoking Project, as well promoting the heart attack '000' awareness campaign during Heart Week.

Ambassadors Paul Hasleby and Robert Haddrill also got behind the charity by launching the Climb to the Top challenge which encouraged Western Australians to improve their heart health by getting active which can be as easy as taking the stairs at work or by going for a walk during a lunch break.

The club's support of its aligned charities is an important part of Community Goals initiative and a part of our role in the Western Australian community that everyone at the club is proud to be involved in and assist wherever possible.

#### Bravery Awards

Fremantle and the South Metropolitan Area Health Service (SMAHS) have developed a unique and lasting relationship through the annual Bravery Awards that have been a key part of the club since 1995.

The Bravery Awards recognise the amazing courage and determination of the special children and young adults who pass through the wards of hospitals within the SMAHS and this year the twelve recipients came from Fremantle Hospital, Rockingham/Kwinana District Hospital, Armadale-Kelmscott Memorial Hospital and Royal Perth Hospital.

The awards were presented by the some of the club's younger players who form the development group, including Marcus Drum, Garrick Ibbotson, Robert Warnock, Benet Copping, Darren Rumble, Clayton Collard, Andrew Foster, and Calib Mourish.

The players introduced each of the award recipients and detailed their outstanding stories of bravery and strength during their hospitalisation, particularly acknowledging the often long recovery process some have faced and still face today.

#### Purple Haze

The annual Purple Haze Game, proudly supported by Fremantle Ports, has become an iconic game for the club to start the home and away season. The Purple Haze Game raises money for the Starlight Children's Foundation and has, since its inception in 2003, raised almost \$114,000 for Starlight to help seriously ill children in Western Australia.

Our Purple Haze Ambassadors Des Headland, Chris Tarrant, Ryan Murphy and Aaron Sandilands again spent time visiting children in the Starlight Express Rooms at hospitals across Perth to lift their spirits and bring smiles to the faces of all the children. We again look forward to the 2008 Starlight Purple Haze Game in round 2 against Hawthorn when we will again look forward to setting another new record to take our total well over \$200,000 for Starlight.

In its fifth year, the Alinta/Red Shield Appeal Game in round 7 saw a record \$17,136 raised for the Salvation Army. This special match aims to provide support to the fantastic work done by the Salvation Army in our community. #### COMMERCIAL OPERATIONS

##### Membership

The support for our club continued to grow again in 2007 and we established, for the fifth consecutive year, record membership as we reached 43,343 members by the official reporting date of 30 June. This loyal support of our members has seen the club become the third highest club membership within the AFL, an amazing achievement. This loyalty was no better demonstrated than by the fact that we achieved almost 100 per cent renewal of our 2006 members.

The club's membership team has done an outstanding job over the last few years to provide quality service and support to the growing number of members that has risen by almost 20,000 members over the last five years.

We achieved record attendances at the club's major membership events for the year including the Junior Member Christmas Party in December 2006, the Family Fun Day in March and the Junior Member Movie Days at Hoyts Cinemas during the year. The club's very popular match day members' luncheons were expanded in 2007 and the four luncheons held this year again proved to be a 'must-do' event for members. Over 300 new members attended the New Member Sundowner at Fremantle Oval in August.

The Sirens, the club's official women's supporter group, held their Season Opener in March and was once again well attended by this growing group of very passionate supporters. The Sirens continues to develop as one of the club's key supporter group.

The club would like to thank our Cheer Squads based in Western Australia and Victoria. They do a fantastic job every game whether that is at home at Subiaco or at any one of our multiple destinations around the country. Our Victorian based Cheer Squad in particular do a fantastic job providing support to the team wherever we travel and this year that included Darwin, Brisbane, Sydney, Adelaide as well as games in Victoria. A special thank you also to our Western Australian Banner Crew for the fantastic work they do in preparing the team banner at every Fremantle home game.

### Match Day

Home game attendances in season 2007 established a new record level with 412,213 patrons attending the eleven home games at Subiaco Oval at an average of 37,474 per game. It is the second consecutive year where home attendances exceeded the 400,000 mark. Five of the club's home games were official sell-outs, a terrific result when it is considered that our average home crowd in 2001 was just 21,258.

The highlights of the season were of course the launch of the home season with the tremendously popular Starlight Purple Haze Game in round 1, the Carlton Mid Derby in round 3, the annual Len Hall game in round 5 which is recognised around the competition as a fantastic recognition of the traditions of Australia's armed services, the round 7 Alinta Red Shield Appeal game and the round 9 match against St Kilda under lights on Friday night that launched the AFL's Indigenous Round nationally.

The match day experience for patrons continues to grow with a host of match day member events, game day sponsor promotions and pre-match activities. These include curtain raisers for the Fremantle Football Club Youth League and other aligned clubs, the fantastic work done with our aligned charities on game day and, of course, our major game day events such as the Len Hall celebrations.

### Corporate Hospitality and Events

It was another fantastic year in the club's game day corporate hospitality with all

match day hospitality selling out for the season with a record number of corporate partners engaging with the club. The quality and presentation of our match day hospitality continues to set high standards, acknowledged by visiting clubs and more importantly by our corporate partners where in the annual hospitality satisfaction survey the club's hospitality packages were recognised as offering an extensive range to meet client needs at great value.

The club's game day corporate hospitality packages continue to be in high demand for the coming year and the club will continue to focus on providing the quality of game day hospitality services for its corporate partners.

The club's major events in 2007 received terrific support starting with the more than 900 guests attending the Official Season Launch in March at the Burswood Grand Ballroom which was hosted by commentator Tim Lane. More than 950 guests attended the Carlton Mid Gala Auction in July which was hosted by Channel 10's Tim Gossage and was also held at the Burswood Grand Ballroom. The year ended with over 1,100 guests attending the gala event of the year, the Doig Medal Presentation Dinner, witnessing Matthew Pavlich claim a record fourth Doig Medal.

Other corporate events through the year included the Corporate Golf Day in March and the corporate interstate trip to the round 10 Friday night clash against Collingwood at the MCG. A range of sponsor events were also scheduled including the Sponsor Season Opener, the sponsor interstate trip to the round 12 game in Darwin, and the sponsor Grand Final Breakfast.

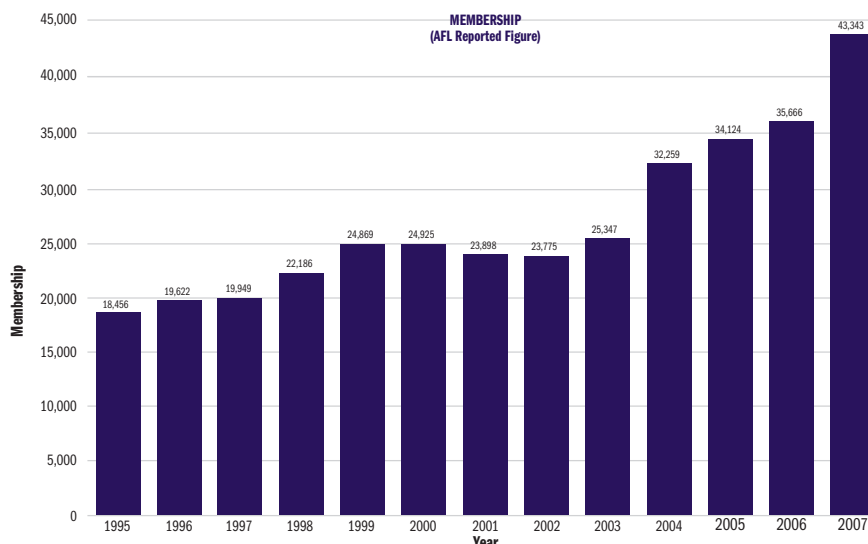
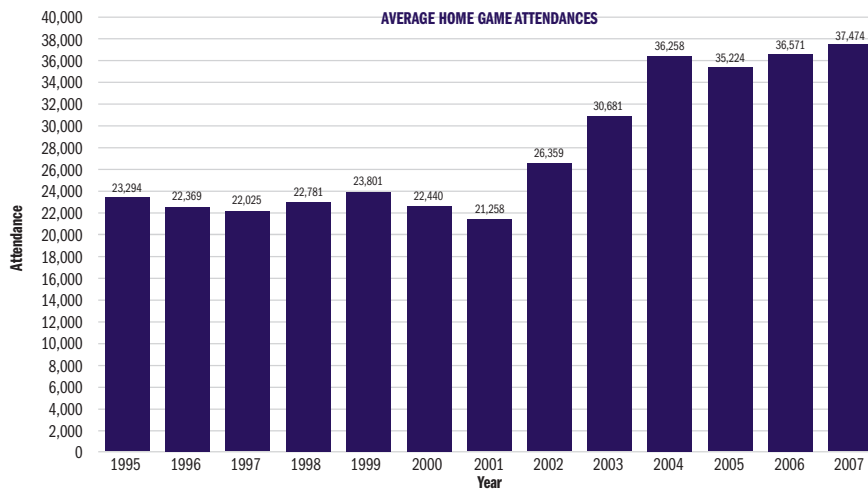
### Merchandise

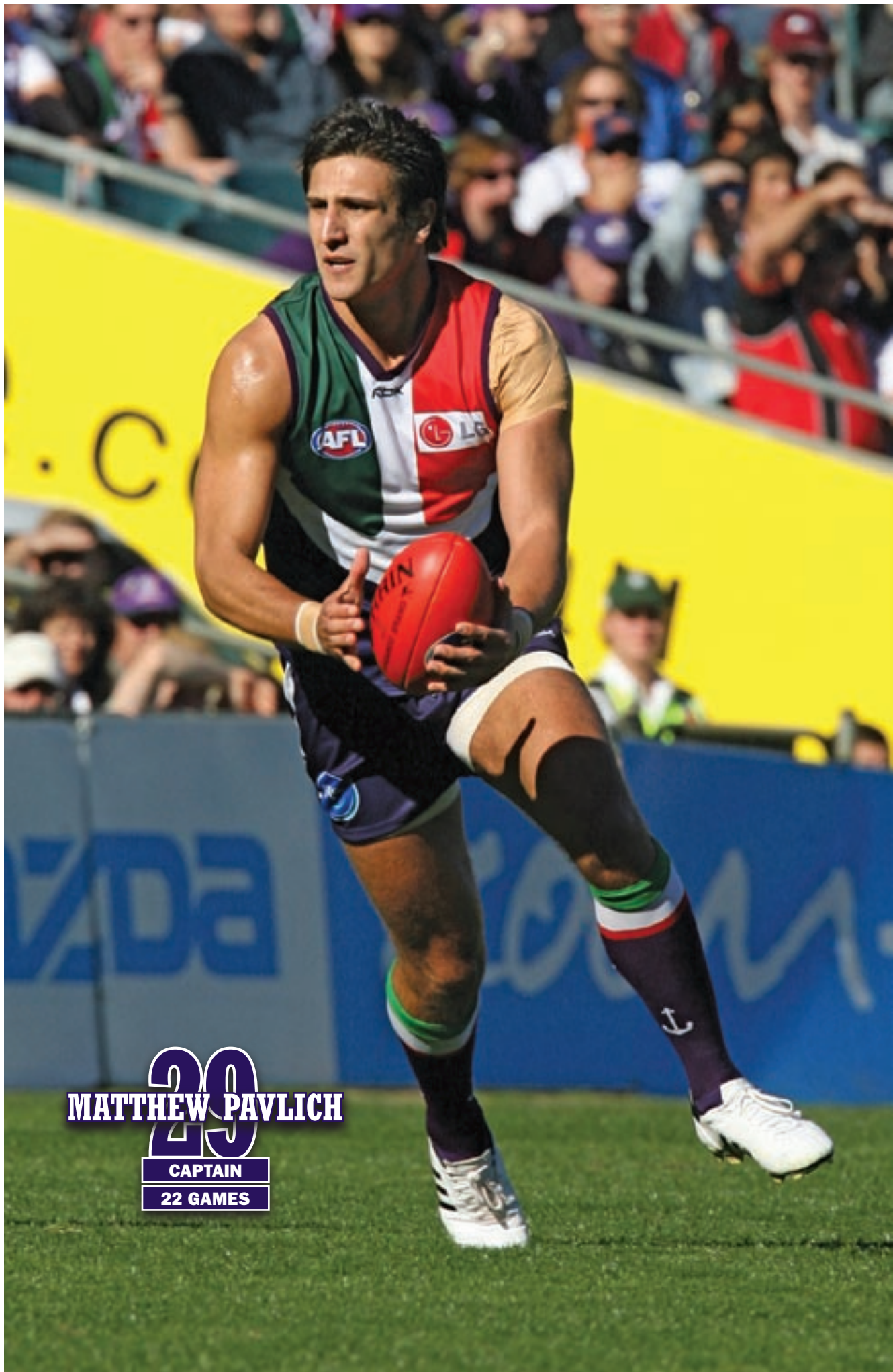

# Farewells

## IN MEMORIAM

Con Regan



1934-2007

CON REGAN was honoured by the AFL with the prestigious Jack Titus Award in 2003, the first Western Australian to receive the award. The award is presented annually in recognition of outstanding service to football.

Con played a total of 261 games for East Fremantle Football Club between 1953 and 1965. In that time East Fremantle made the top four every year and won two Premierships in 1957 and 1965. Con became the first player to play 250 games for East Fremantle. He also played in 25 WAFL finals games and nine state games.

The highlight of his career was playing in the winning 1961 Australian Carnival Team.

Con had been involved in football continually since 1941 from junior football in Fremantle and continued on to be the inaugural Team Manager for the Fremantle Football Club.

After winning the WAFL Grand Final in 1965, Con was transferred as a Police Officer to Katanning where he not only captained/coached Wanderers Football Club but also co-founded the Central Great Southern Junior Sports Council.

He also captained/coached the East Fremantle Sunday League

Team as well as Donnybrook Football Club. Both teams won at least one premiership while Con was in charge.

In 1963, Con was made a Life Member of the East Fremantle Football Club and a member of the WAFL "200" Club. In 1996 he was elected to the Fremantle City Hall of Fame and in 1997 he was made a Legend in the Fremantle Football Club's Hall of Legends.

As well as his football achievements Con was also very successful in water polo, playing more than 50 years senior water polo with the Melville Club.



SHANE PARKER

– Retirement

Shane is an inaugural Fremantle player and club games record holder. He made his AFL debut in round 3, 1995 at the Western Oval against Fitzroy and went on to be the first player to play 200 games and played 238 games over his 13 year career for Fremantle.

Shane was runner-up in the club's Best and Fairest, the Doig Medal, in 1997 and 2005 and was placed third in 2002. He was selected in the WA State of Origin team three times, in 2002, 2004 and 2006, and was club vice-captain in 2002. He was also a part of Subiaco's 2007 WAFL premiership team.



TROY COOK

– Retirement

Drafted at Selection 27 by the Sydney Swans, Troy made his AFL debut in round 3, 1997 and he received a Rising Star nomination in 1997. Troy went on to play 43 games for Sydney before joining Fremantle at the end of the 1999 season.

He made his debut for Fremantle in round 1, 2000 and played 150 games for the club, earning himself Life Membership. He won the club's Doig Medal in 2000 and in 2005 he received the Best Clubman Award. A noted hard-man around the contests, he was the club's leading tackler in 2000-2003 and 2005, also finishing in the top 10 in the AFL in 2000, 2002 and 2003.



JUSTIN LONGMUIR

– Retirement

Justin was drafted number two overall in the 1998 National AFL Draft and debuted in round 22, 1999. He went on to play 139 games for Fremantle with the most memorable moment being his kick after the siren in round 21, 2005 against St Kilda at Subiaco Oval. That winning moment then became the cornerstone of the club's 2006 membership television campaign.

Over the last two seasons Justin has been restricted to just 18 games due to a knee injury and on April 27 this year was placed on the club's long term injury list. It was due to this injury that his football career has had to come to a premature end.



JAMES WALKER

James was taken with the club's first selection (no. 6 overall) in the 1997 National Draft and made his debut in round 19, 1998 against Essendon. He went on to play 151 games for the club and played his 150th game for the club in round 12 this year earning him Life Membership.

Originally from Ballarat, James is the first Victorian born player to earn Life Membership with Fremantle and become only the fifth player in the club's history to play 150 games. James played in the club's first finals appearance against Essendon in 2003 at Subiaco Oval.



ROBERT HADRILL

Robert was a product of the club's Rookie List, elevated to the senior list midway through the 2001 season. He made his AFL debut in round 15, 2001 and he went on to play 58 games for the club in what was unfortunately an injury interrupted career.

In 2003 he played in Fremantle's first finals appearance against Essendon at Subiaco Oval and earned his first State of Origin jumper. Season 2004 saw Robert represent Australia in the International Rules series in Ireland and for the second successive year he was named in WA's State of Origin team.



RYLEY DUNN

Ryley was taken with the club's first selection (no. 10 overall) in the 2003 National Draft after twice achieving All-Australian status following the National Under 18's championships. Ryley made his debut in round 1, 2004 against Carlton at Subiaco Oval.



CLAYTON COLLARD

In 2006 Clayton represented WA at the National Under 18's Championships before being taken with the club's first selection at number 31 in the 2006 NAB AFL Draft. Season 2007 saw Clayton debut for Fremantle in Round 9 against St Kilda.



CALIB MOURISH

Originally from Geraldton, Calib was selected in the 2006 NAB AFL Draft (No. 77 overall). A product of the Clontarf Academy in Geraldton, he was involved with East Fremantle's country development squads before being drafted.



BENET COPPING

Benet was on the senior list for two years after being drafted in the 2005 National Draft. He joined the Rookie List this season where he has spent the year playing mostly in the seniors for East Perth in the WAFL.



DARREN RUMBLE

After playing in two premierships with Subiaco, Darren joined the club's Rookie list in 2007. With his season spent playing seniors in the WAFL, Darren became a triple premiership player for Subiaco.
