From the President

There is no question that with only six wins to speak of, Season 2008 was a year of lost opportunity.

To lose eight games by 10 points or less was as disappointing as it was frustrating.

But no matter how close the margin – including the agonising one-point defeat at the hands of Geelong in Round 6 – there is no such a thing as a good loss.

You can look for excuses – the loss through injury of Paul Hasleby for the entire season and Des Headland for 16 games – but a club seeking sustained on-field success has to be able to cope better with the absence of such key players.

It became evident early in the season that we had a problem with some aspects of our conditioning – an AFL record of five consecutive losses, after leading at three-quarter time, highlighting this area as a concern for our football operations.

The club went on the front foot, seeking and being granted approval by the Board to carry out two independent reviews of the club's strength and conditioning operations and our medical operations.

The two independent reviews found that we had not been at the required levels in these areas and, consequently, we had not fully harnessed the talent of our team.

Since the appointment of Chief Executive Officer Steve Rosich in July, we have made key changes in our football department, including appointing Jason Weber as Sports Science Manager and Chris Bond taking on the role of General Manager Football Operations.

It would be wrong to imply that 2008 was not without its highlights. Rhys Palmer's debut season was stunning, with the 19-year-old capping off the year by winning the NAB AFL Rising Star Award and being named the AFL Players' Association Best First Year Player.

The emergence of young players such as Rhys along with NAB AFL Rising Star nominee Garrick Ibbotson, Chris Mayne and Clayton Hinkley is reason to look forward to the first bounce in 2009.

Similarly the decision by David Mundy to resign with the club for another two years and decisions by Garrick Ibbotson (2011), Roger Hayden (2010) and Antoni Grover (2010) to seek extensions on their existing contracts is a great boost for the club and our proud, loyal and passionate supporters.

Club Captain Matthew Pavlich showed why he is one of the AFL's genuine superstars, winning a record fifth Doig Medal as the club's best and fairest player and his sixth All Australian selection. Doig Medal runner-up Aaron Sandilands also earned All Australian selection while third placed Luke McPharlin narrowly missed out on the honour of being named in the All Australian side.

We are fortunate that players of the calibre of Matthew, Aaron and Luke plus Ryan Crowley, Roger Hayden, Antoni

Grover and David Mundy provide such a solid foundation on which to base our playing group.

Season 2008 also saw the retirement of seven senior players, in Peter Bell, Shaun McManus, Jeff Farmer, Heath Black, Matthew Carr, Luke Webster and Mark Johnson.

No matter how short or long their time at Fremantle, each of these players made a significant contribution to the club and I wish them well in their future endeavours, particularly Shaun (Assistant Player Development Coach) and Luke Webster (Player Development Manager) who will continue their professional association with the club after accepting appointments in the football department in November.

In September, the WA Football Commission (WAFC) endorsed the appointments of lawyer Grant Donaldson SC and company director Steve Harris to the Board of Directors of the Fremantle Football Club.

Grant and Steve are great additions to our talented and hard working Board.

In the same month, Vice President Mel Ashton advised the club and the WAFC that he would not be seeking an extension of his current Board term after it expired on 30 November.

Mel has made an outstanding contribution to the club since he was first appointed to the Board of Directors in 2002 and I personally thank him for his efforts during his time on the Board.

Grant, who was a member of the club's Board of Management from 1994 to 1997, has been in legal practice for over 20 years and was appointed Senior Counsel in 2004.

A Fremantle member since 2002, Steve is the Managing Director of The Brand Agency,

a diversified marketing and communications business with an annual turnover exceeding \$120 million.

The WAFC also endorsed the re-appointment of Brian O'Donnell, who is the Group Treasurer and a Director of Kerry Stokes' Australian Capital Equity, for a second three-year term on the Board.

We are very fortunate to have people of the calibre of Grant, Steve and Brian on the Board of the Fremantle Football Club.

While 2008 was a year of lost opportunity it was also one of significant change at the club. We have a new CEO in Steve Rosich, who, after overseeing the two independent reviews of the club's strength and conditioning operations and our medical operations, made several key appointments as mentioned previously.

With the prospect of reinvigorating our list with 14 new, young players via the National and Rookie Drafts, Senior Coach Mark Harvey will have the opportunity to stamp his imprimatur on the playing group and deliver on his promise to establish a winning culture at Fremantle.

With the committed support of his CEO, General Manager Football Operations and the Board, I am confident that Mark is the right person at the right time to do the right job for our club in 2009 and beyond as we seek to achieve our aim of sustained on-field success.

From the Senior Coach

It is always an interesting process to cast your mind back over the highs and lows of a football season.

The key measure for any team in the AFL is on-field performance.

On that score our 6-16 result in 2008 was simply not good enough.

But that does not mean the emergence of our young and developing players such as Rhys Palmer, or the continued dominance of Matthew Pavlich, or the All Australian form of Aaron Sandilands should be overlooked.

The team was willing and competitive. The players tried to do everything that we asked of them but in the end it took its toll when they couldn't sustain it. This manifested itself in our inability to place opposition sides under sustained pressure, particularly late in games.

At the time there was nothing to be gained by offering excuses.

It was far better to act to identify the reasons why, introduce the measures needed to rectify it and ensure that it doesn't happen again.

One aspect of that action was the commissioning of two independent mid-season reviews of our strength and conditioning operations, and medical operations. These reviews resulted in the appointment of former Wallabies high performance manager Jason Weber as our Sports Science Manager along with other key appointments in the area.

Under Jason's fitness regime, the players' workload will be increased quite significantly in the 2009 pre-season. You will not necessarily notice an immediate improvement, particularly with some of the senior players but with the younger players it will be more evident.

The influence of the midfield on results in the modern game continues to grow.

As a result, we have also boosted our midfield coaching ranks with the addition of former Hawthorn assistant coach Barry Mitchell and Todd Curley, who was previously senior coach of West Perth in the WAFL.

The retirement of seven senior players in one season has provided a tremendous opportunity to reinvigorate our playing list via the National and Rookie Drafts with 14 new players.

That is as exciting as it is challenging, particularly when you consider that our oldest player will be 28 while the majority of his team mates will be 19 to 20-year-olds.

I have no doubt that our members and supporters understand that we are trying to evolve and develop this football club. My aim is to build a team that is capable of achieving sustained on-field success. Make no mistake we are building a team, not "rebuilding" a team.

While it is reassuring that we have been able to fast track some of our young and developing players, this football club has a lot of players that we are still to see the best of.

We are fortunate to have key players such as Matthew Pavlich, Aaron Sandilands and Luke McPharlin whom we can build our team around.

As mentioned, we had seven retirements this season in Peter Bell, Shaun McManus, Jeff Farmer, Matthew Carr, Heath Black, Luke Webster and Mark Johnson.

Each of them brought something special to Fremantle and made significant contributions, not only to our club but to the great game of football itself.

It is also important to acknowledge the efforts of our players, coaches and specialist staff in 2008. I know they are driven by the desire to achieve across all levels in 2009.

Finally, without the ongoing support of our club's supporters, members, corporate partners and sponsors none of the aims we have for 2009 and beyond would be achievable.

Your proud, loyal and passionate support is outstanding and genuinely appreciated.

We depend on it and I look forward to your continued support in Season 2009.

From the Captain

The day Rhys Palmer won the 2008 NAB AFL Rising Star Award, he revealed that his goal at the start of the year was to play five games in his debut season.

Instead, the 19-year-old went on to play 20 games and pick up more possessions than when Collingwood champion Nathan Buckley won the inaugural award back in 1993.

In reviewing the year, I have chosen to focus, initially, on Rhys' debut season because it clearly demonstrates that our club is one of great opportunity.

While the combination of losing Paul Hasleby (season) and Des Headland (16 games) through injury plus the mid-season retirements of Peter Bell and Matthew Carr robbed the team of invaluable experience, it also created tremendous opportunity for players such as Rhys, Garrick Ibbotson, Chris Mayne and Clayton Hinkley.

To finish the season with only six wins was simply not good enough but the experience those young and developing players gained by stepping up in 2008 will stand the club in good stead in 2009 and beyond.

The level of excitement and enthusiasm that these young and developing players inject into our club is really encouraging and is tremendous for the rest of the player group.

In addition to the mid-season retirements of Peter and Matthew, five other players in

Shaun McManus, Heath Black, Jeff Farmer, Luke Webster and Mark Johnson also called an end to their AFL careers.

Just like it was for many of our supporters, it was quite an emotional time for me when so many fellow players, including some who have been my close mates for a long time, called it a day.

It also meant that our emerging on-field leaders, such as and Luke McPharlin and Aaron Sandilands, had to embrace and develop the leadership qualities of the retiring players.

I acknowledge the challenge of being Captain and the responsibility of ensuring that I lead in the right direction. But I am steadfast in my belief that we must continue to foster the continuing emergence of not only Luke and Aaron as leaders of our club but also players such as Antoni Grover, David Mundy and Roger Hayden.

In addition to Paul Hasleby and Des Headland being back in the team, fit and fired up, I also look forward to both of them taking on more responsibility as leaders.

But the changing of the guard has not been limited to just on-field.

In July 2008, Steve Rosich was appointed Chief Executive Officer, followed three months later by Chris Bond's appointment as our new General Manager Football Operations.

Since then Jason Weber (Sports Science Manager), Chris Spinks (Strength and Conditioning Coach) Barry Mitchell

(Assistant Coach), Todd Curley (Assistant Coach), Shaun McManus (Assistant Player Development Coach) and Luke Webster (Player Development Manager) have joined the football department.

The change in personnel across a range of areas has given the club a real buzz and instilled it with a sense of excitement and purpose about the challenges that lay ahead.

One of the challenges in 2009 is to regain a strong home ground advantage.

In the past couple of seasons Subiaco Oval has shed its aura as the 'House of Pain' for visiting sides taking on Fremantle at WA's home of football. But before that can happen we will be pushing, striving and driving ourselves throughout the summer so that come Round 1 of Season 2009, we will be ready to deliver the consistent performances our supporters deserve and expect.

Finally, thank you to all our supporters, members, corporate partners and sponsors for supporting the Fremantle Football Club in 2008.

I look forward to your proud, loyal and passionate support continuing in 2009.

2008 Doig Medal



Doig Medallist: **Matthew Pavlich**

Club Captain Matthew Pavlich claimed an unprecedented fourth consecutive Doig Medal as Fremantle's best and fairest player for the 2008 AFL Season.

His 2008 Doig Medal took his career tally to five following his earlier wins in 2002, 2005, 2006 and 2007. He was runner-up in 2003 and finished in third place in 2004, demonstrating his consistency throughout his career with Fremantle.

In yet another outstanding season, which saw him receive his sixth career All Australian selection, Matthew led Fremantle's goal kicking with 67 majors at an average of 3.5 per game, as well as ranking in the club's top five for kicks, marks, inside 50s and hard ball gets despite missing three matches late in the season due to injury.

The year saw Matthew play a variety of roles as a key forward and attacking midfielder, exemplifying his capacity to fill any position on the field and make an immediate impact when his ability to significantly influence matches was required.

He took his impressive streak of consecutive matches to 160 before injury forced him to miss his first game since Round 14, 2001 when he was unable to line up against Port Adelaide in Round 17.

Playing in 19 of Fremantle's 22 matches this season, Matthew took his career games tally to 194 and is on track to become just the third player in club history to reach 200 matches with Fremantle behind Shane Parker (238) and Shaun McManus (228).

Runner Up: Aaron Sandilands

In arguably his best season yet with Fremantle, Aaron imposed himself on the AFL in Season 2008 as one of the competition's most influential tap ruckmen, a feat that saw him earn his first career selection in the All Australian team and third consecutive selection in the WA State of Origin team.

His league leading 646 hit outs in 2008 is a club record and was 75 more than his closest challenger, fellow All Australian ruckman Dean Cox.

Such was Aaron's consistent influence in matches, he finished in Fremantle's top five for handballs, hard ball gets and clearances in 2008 and was one of only three Fremantle players to appear in each of the club's 22 home and away matches.

Fremantle's match committee gave Aaron maximum votes in the 2008 Doig Medal vote count for his performance against Geelong on ANZAC Day in Round 6, which saw the 25-year-old collect 24 possessions, six marks, one goal and dominate the ruck with 42 hit outs.

His result in the 2008 Doig Medal count is his best finish in the award after finishing equal fifth in 2006.



Third Place: Luke McPharlin

Replicating his placing in the 2007 Doig Medal count, Luke McPharlin again received a top three finish, just one vote behind Aaron Sandilands.

Luke has carved a name for himself as one of the finest defenders in the AFL but has shown he can be just as reliable at the other end of the ground.

Playing as a key forward on several occasions in 2008, Luke kicked 21 goals this year including a five goal haul against West Coast in Round 18. When you couple his goal kicking ability with his solid defensive work when opposed to the league's most dangerous forwards, there is no doubt that Luke is one of the AFL's most versatile key position players.

Luke finished the 2008 season in Fremantle's top five for goals and marks and was named at centre half back in the WA State of Origin team, which was also his fourth career selection in the WA line up.

Fourth Place: Rhys Palmer

There have been few debut seasons in recent memory that rival that of Rhys Palmer's. In just his first season of AFL football the 19 year old made 20 appearances for Fremantle and ended the season as the club's highest possession getter with 462.

His ability to influence matches was identified early in the season when, in the absence of more experienced midfielders, Rhys was assigned the opposition's best tagger. The close attention he commanded failed to impact his ability to win the ball, as he averaged 23 possessions per game in 2008.

His hard running, work ethic and ability to read the play will no doubt see Rhys become a cornerstone in what will be a revolutionary Fremantle midfield in Season 2009 and beyond.



Best Clubman: Luke Webster

On the field, Luke was restricted to just four WAFL matches in 2008 due to sustaining his fourth serious knee injury while playing for East Perth on 5 April.

He underwent the revolutionary Ligament Augmentation Replacement Surgery which saw an industrial strength polyester ligament grafted into his knee to significantly shorten his recovery period.

While most would have wallowed away with self pity through sustaining such an injury for a fourth time, Luke devoted his time to assisting the club in a range of ventures, both football and commercial related, going above and beyond all expectations.

Luke's willingness to rise above his own personal situation and make highly valued, passionate and genuine contributions to the Fremantle Football Club made him a deserving winner of this award for the second time in three seasons.

Beacon Award: Rhys Palmer

Complementing his fourth place in the Doig Medal count, Rhys also claimed the 2008 Beacon Award as the club's best new talent in his brilliant debut season with Fremantle.

The Beacon Award was Rhys' third individual honour bestowed on him for his outstanding debut season. In September he had also won the prestigious 2008 NAB AFL Rising Star Award as well as the AFL Players' Association Award for Best First Year Player.

To be eligible to win the Beacon Award, the winner must be under the age of 21 years on or before 31 December of the previous year and have played less than 10 games at the start of the season.

Rhys joined the club through the 2007 NAB AFL Draft and made his debut in Round 2 against Hawthorn, collecting 22 disposals and a goal in his first AFL game.

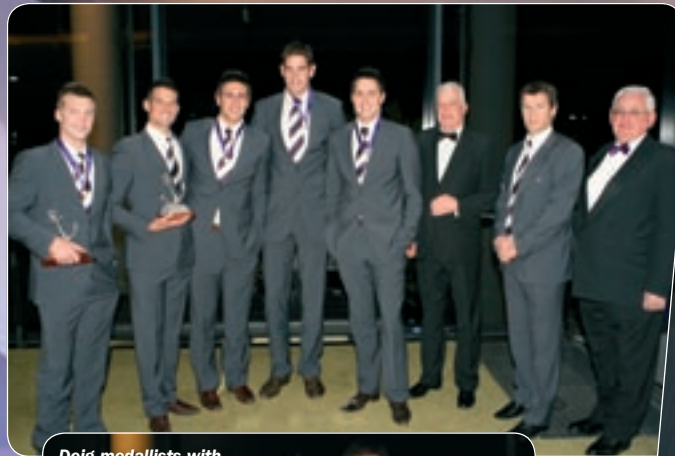

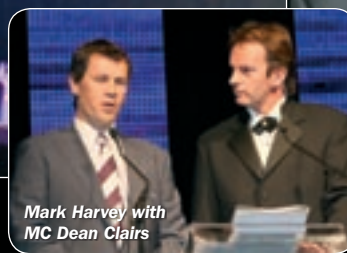

From the Chief Executive Officer

Although Season 2008 can be marked down as a disappointing year for the Fremantle Football Club due to our on-field results, it was also a time for change and opportunity to be grasped.

Clearly, our on-field results did not reflect expectations but the resilience shown by several of our young and developing players as they evolved throughout the course of the season was particularly pleasing.

While the retirement of seven senior players in one season is a rare event at an AFL club, it has provided the opportunity to reinvigorate our playing list with up to 14 players joining the club via the National and Rookie Drafts.

With some of those retirements occurring mid-season it enabled several of our young and developing players to accept increased responsibility and test their mettle at the highest level.

There are many challenges to be met in the future as we strive to be a great football club.

I am proud of our club and what we have achieved off-field and I am relishing the challenge of working with our dedicated staff, coaches and players to achieve our aim of sustained on-field success.

We have a purpose and a plan as we strive to ensure that we have the best structures, staff and resources in place to prepare for the influx of new draftees, as well as providing the entire playing group with the first class environment required to achieve our goals.

To this end, we have made a number of changes across our football operations in the areas of coaching, development, welfare and sports science.

Significantly, we conducted two independent reviews of our strength and conditioning operations and medical operations. The two reviews established that we were not at the required levels in these areas.

As a result we have made key changes in our football department, including appointing Jason Weber as Sports Science Manager. Jason, who reports to recently appointed General Manager Football Operations Chris Bond, was previously at the Australian Rugby Union where he was high performance manager of the Wallabies.

We have also appointed Socceroos head of sports science Darren Burgess as a consultant to our Sports Science Program.

Our focus is to reach the level being attained by some of our competitors and then work even harder to stay ahead of the pack. This will require a committed and disciplined execution.

Our pursuit of sustained success is not possible without the support of our proud, loyal and passionate board, staff, sponsors, corporate partners and members and we recognise the outstanding and committed support of these most important club stakeholders.

Our Board, management and staff are selfless in their endeavours and we could

not be prouder of their dedication to our football club.

Our sponsors, headed by LG Electronics, are committed to our club and we are delighted to be able to continue to serve them in their future partnership aims.

Our members and corporate partners are among the most football savvy in the country. We are very fortunate to have so many committed to our club and we thank you for your ongoing support of your football club.

For the sixth consecutive year, record membership levels were achieved and a record number of corporate partners also established or renewed their relationships with Fremantle. The number of sponsors we secured and associated sponsorship revenue, which surpassed \$8 million for the first time in the club's history, also vastly exceeded expectations.

The AFL is a tough and uncompromising competition and we do not yet have the right to pronounce any external expectations regarding our on-field success. There are only two teams that currently have that right – they are the two grand finalists from Season 2008.

Our expectation is that we will do everything that we can to secure that right ourselves.

That is our challenge.

2008 Club Operations Report

FOOTBALL

On the field, we did not achieve what we set out to do in Season 2008. While it was disappointing that we were only able to win six games, there were still some positive signs for the future.

Every player on the Primary List played at least one AFL game this year, except for Paul Hasleby and Luke Webster, who suffered his fourth, and what became a career-ending knee injury. We also lost Paul for the season after he suffered a serious knee injury in the first round of the NAB Cup.

Therefore, the coaching staff were able to assess all players on our Primary List at senior game level, which puts us at an advantage going into the 2009 season.

Obviously, the players who have left the club during the 2008 season will be difficult to replace in the short-term.

Matthew Carr was the first to retire and his departure in May was the start of a wave of retirements.

Peter Bell, our most experienced and admired player, finished after 286 games. Heath Black ended his AFL career following 192 games with both Fremantle and St Kilda. While Mark Johnson had only one-year and 14 games with Fremantle, he brought down the curtain on a career that spanned 208 games.

Shaun McManus' farewell game was in the last Carlton Mid Derby for the year and was a memorable day for both Shaun and the Fremantle Football Club. Shaun played 228 games and was the last remaining player from the original playing list of 1995.

At season's end, Jeff Farmer also called an end to his career after 249 games and 483 goals and Luke Webster hung up the boots after six years and 33 games, taking the number of retirements for 2008 to seven.

Club Captain Matthew Pavlich capped another dominant season, winning a record fifth Doig Medal, while Aaron Sandilands, who is now one of the AFL's premier ruckmen, was runner-up. Matthew and Aaron were also both rewarded with All Australian selection.

Young gun Rhys Palmer had an outstanding debut season, winning the NAB AFL Rising Star Award and being named the AFL Players' Association Best First Year Player.

Meanwhile, key defender Roger Hayden and midfielder Ryan Crowley were honoured with selection in the Australia team that played Ireland in the International Rules series.

The decision by Robert Warnock (Carlton) and Josh Carr (Port Adelaide) to play elsewhere in Season 2009 has enabled the club to have a significant presence in the 2008 National Draft. This will assist in us being able to build a playing list for the future.

The departure of Robert, Josh and the seven retirees represents a loss of 1567 games of experience and talent. While this may sound daunting, it also enables the club to build for the future. Because of the significant shift in the playing list

in 2008, the football club has instigated a new structure in the fitness, medical, development and coaching areas heading into the 2009 season.

With former general manager football operations Robert Shaw returning home to Victoria at season's end, there was the opportunity for general manager list development Chris Bond to take on the important role of General Manager Football Operations.

We have appointed Jason Weber as our new Sports Science Manager. Jason will oversee all aspects of our fitness and medical departments. Jason comes with a wealth of experience, having most recently been the high performance manager of the Wallabies. Former Port Adelaide strength and conditioning coach Chris Spinks has accepted a similar role at Fremantle. Michael Dobbin, who was previously at AFL Tasmania, is Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach.

We have also appointed current Socceroos Fitness Coach and Head of Sports Science Darren Burgess as a consultant to our Sports Science Program. Darren, the former head of sports science at Port Adelaide, and Jason, both have extensive experience in managing international programs for national athletes.

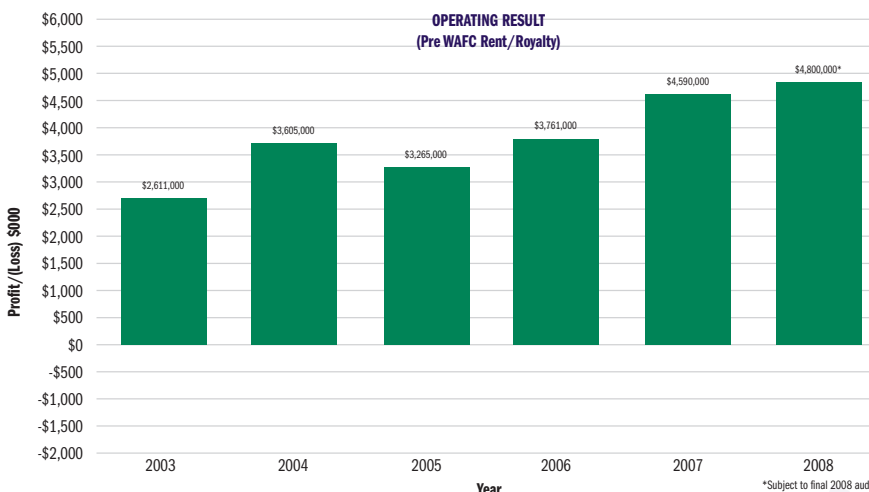
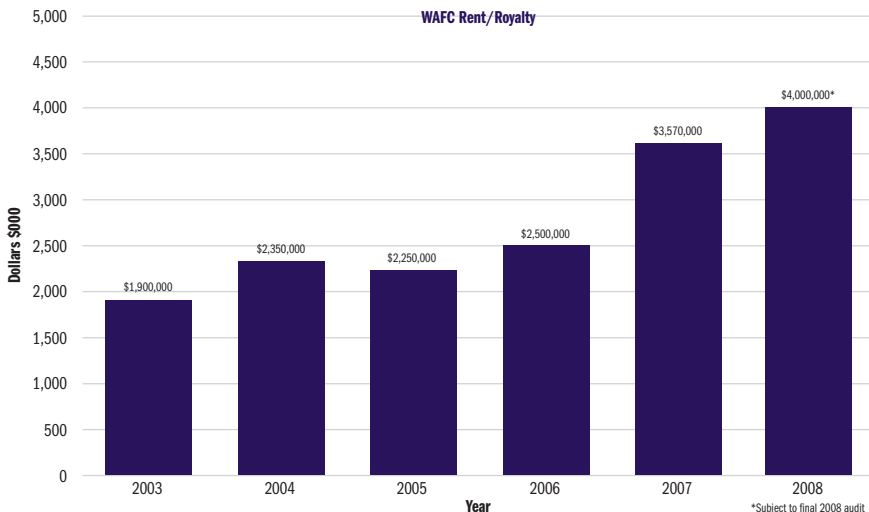
With the new staff we have in this area we believe we now have a structure that will be more than competitive with other clubs in the AFL.

Our coaching structure has also been strengthened with the appointments of Barry Mitchell and Todd Curley working closely together as midfield coaches. Barry comes from previous coaching stints at Carlton and Hawthorn and Todd has impressed as a young coach at West Perth in the WAFL.

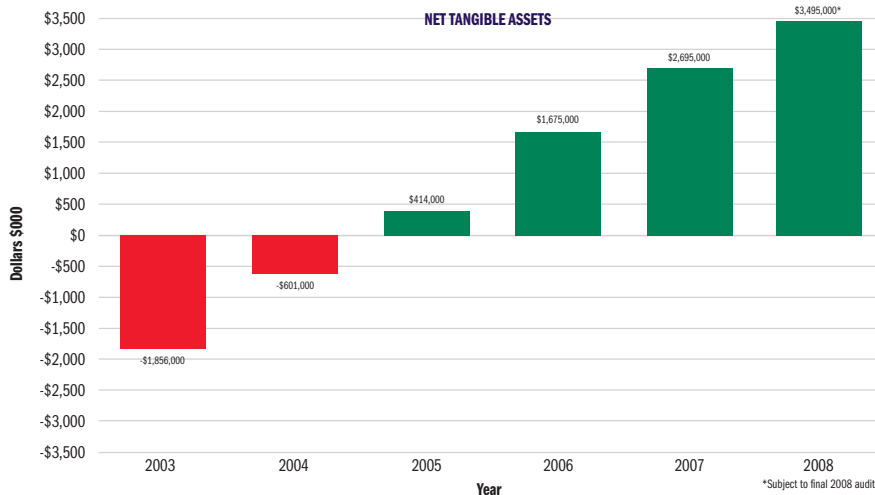
All involved at the Fremantle Football Club are looking forward to building a playing list for us to achieve sustained on-field success. The introduction of new players and staff will bring new enthusiasm going into the pre-season. In 2009, we will not have a player on our list over the age of 28 and this indicates the direction that we are heading in for the future.

FINANCE

Our financial management during the 2008 year will deliver another strong performance for the club. Whilst the amount is not final at the time of publishing, it is expected that the operating result will come in around \$4.8m (prior to rent and royalty payments). Based on a new methodology of calculating the rent/royalty payment to the Western Australian Football Commission, it is expected the club's contribution will approximately be \$4m

in 2008. As such, retained earnings are forecast to be slightly less than the 2007 figure of \$1.02m. Revenues are forecast to approximate \$35m, an increase of 8% on the \$32.46m achieved in 2007.

The club has continually increased its contribution to the WAFC from \$1.9m in 2003 to approximately \$4m in 2008, effectively doubling the support to local and grassroots football in Western Australia. The club is also building its reserves by increasing Net Tangible Assets to approximately \$3.5m. This is important as it ensures the club is strongly positioned for the future to manage our own financial destiny and fund our own development.

Finally, governance and risk management continues to be a priority for the club. We work closely with the AFL to ensure high risk areas are considered and dealt with appropriately.

SPONSORSHIP



Whilst 2007 was a record year for sponsorship at Fremantle, 2008 took things to a whole new level. The commercial result in sponsorship exceeded the club's expectations, both in the number of sponsors that we secured and the overall revenue. This year's gross sponsorship revenue surpassed \$8 million for the first time in the club's history and Fremantle secured 28 partners as sponsors. This is a great return on the years of hard work as we develop a reputation for being commercially astute and yielding excellent return on investment for our commercial partners.

It was reported in November that Fremantle's major sponsorship property was adjudged the seventh most valuable against all football sporting properties in the country. The brand awareness is measured

across all football codes by Repucum (previously S-Comm) and converted to a dollar value and these results are vital in Fremantle demonstrating 'return on investment' to our valuable clients.

This year also saw a number of new partners join the club and we welcome HBA Health Insurance, Salta Constructions, Cape Bouvard Investments and Nutrition Systems on board for their first year with the club. All four companies recognise the power of the AFL as a marketing tool and Fremantle as an exciting club.

Season 2008 wasn't just about finding new partners, it was also about renewing relationships with existing partners. It saw Marine and Civil move from being a Silver Level Sponsor to a Diamond Level Sponsor and become the Coaches Sponsor for the next two years. Marine and Civil is a company with a huge future and we thank everyone at Marine and Civil for their support. Reebok also renewed its association with Fremantle for a further four years. Fremantle proudly endorses Reebok products and is delighted that together we will work toward the success that our team has been working so hard to achieve.

Some sponsors took the opportunity this year to increase their investment with our club and move to a higher sponsorship level, with Members Equity Bank and Mazda Australia becoming Diamond Level Sponsors while BigPond, Gemmill Homes, West Australian Newspapers and Integrated moved to Gold Level Sponsors.

We are also delighted that in 2008 we were able to retain our Major Sponsor LG Electronics. LG will continue as the joint Major Sponsor in 2009 before becoming a Gold Level Sponsor in 2010. We thank Managing Director Daniel Shin and all the team at LG for their continued support of the club.

Thank you to all of our sponsors for your continued faith in our club as we look forward to 2009 with great enthusiasm.

We also thank all supporters, members and followers of the Fremantle Football Club for supporting those who support us and encourage you to continue aligning your commercial decisions with these sponsors.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

Strategic Partnerships was an area of real growth for Fremantle in 2008, securing 12 partners in just our first year. Perhaps the most exciting initiative for this area was our strengthened position in South Africa. Fremantle played an AFL Exhibition game in February against Carlton in Pretoria, winning by 14 points. Thanks to our commercial partners Nkwe Platinum Ltd, Continental Capital and Air Mauritius. Also to Fremantle players and staff who conducted football development clinics in our zone in South Africa, the North West Province.



This year also saw the establishment and incorporation of the Fremantle Communities Foundation (FCF). This is an important initiative for Fremantle and extends the club's commitment to the community and youth in general. The FCF's charter is "to make Western Australian communities healthier and happier". The FCF will be seeking support for its programs during 2009, so stay tuned for more on this exciting club initiative.

CORPORATE PARTNERS

For the sixth consecutive year a record number of corporate partners engaged with the club, resulting in all match day hospitality selling out for the season. The quality of our match day hospitality continues to be a benchmark for all AFL clubs.

Highlights on the season calendar included the Player Sponsor Golf Day and Dinner at Burswood Golf Park. Representatives from 36 companies played a round of Ambrose golf with their chosen sponsored player. Summit Fertilizers won the competition for the second consecutive year and guest speaker, Footscray legend Doug Hawkins, entertained an appreciative crowd.

The destination for the Official Corporate Trip was Sydney for the Round 19 match against the Swans. Guests who enjoyed the weekend away were wined and dined at Woolloomooloo Wharf while almost 150 people attended the match day function at the SCG.

MEMBERSHIP

For the sixth consecutive year record membership levels were achieved, with 43,366 members signing up to the club by the official reporting date of 30 June. This loyal support by our members has seen Fremantle maintain its standing as a club with the third highest membership in the AFL, a fantastic achievement.

With membership numbers increasing by more than 70 per cent since 2003, the

club's membership team has continued to provide quality service and support to the growing number of members.

The club's major membership events for the year, including the Family Fun Day in March and the Junior Member Movie Days at Hoyts Cinemas during the year, again achieved record attendances.

A trip to Melbourne by the Sirens, the club's official women's supporter group, was a huge success with the ladies taking in the Round 13 clash with St Kilda at Telstra Dome. The post match function saw Senior Coach Mark Harvey and Club Captain Matthew Pavlich address the 400 delighted guests, which included the Sirens, Corporate Partners and Victorian/Interstate Members. This was a great opportunity for the supporters to mingle with the players, get autographs, pose for photographs with their favourite players or just enjoy the chance to talk football with other Fremantle faithful.

Our Victorian Members also enjoyed a post-match function after the Round 9 Carlton clash, providing an opportunity for Victorian members to mingle and get to know each other after the game.

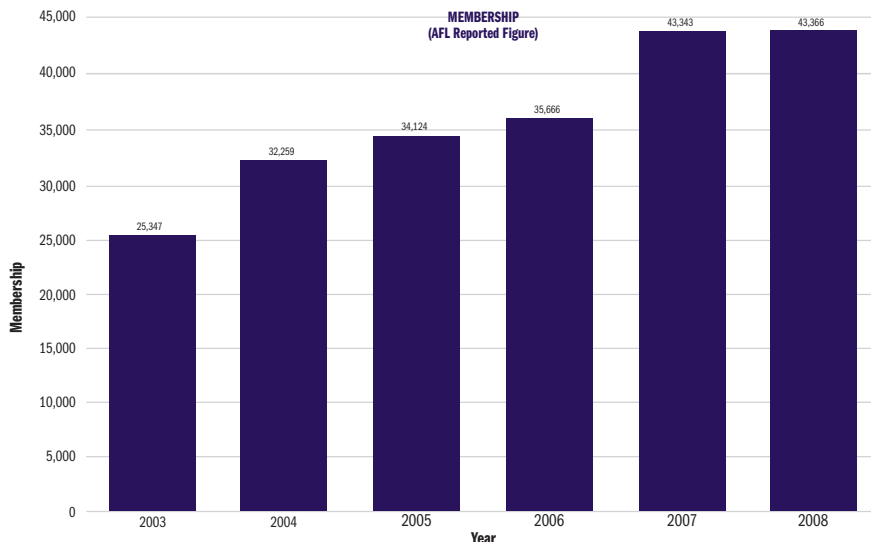
Equally well received was our inaugural away game function in the Bill Walker Room at Subiaco Oval for the Round 21 broadcast game against Richmond at the MCG. Hosted by Dean Clairs, the 250 guests heard from players Andrew Foster and Josh Head, who both provided insights into their football journeys.

There was also a successful Auskick Gala Day held at Templestowe in Melbourne for our Junior Members and our aligned club, the Templestowe Park Football Club. The gala day was held on the morning after the St Kilda game and despite some inclement weather, more than 300 proud, loyal and passionate youngsters made the most of their time to have fun with the Fremantle players.

The clinic provided a rare opportunity for Victorian members and supporters to spend some time with the players they loyally support from across the Nullarbor as well as improve their football skills with the help of our players.

There is also a huge amount of effort that goes unseen when making the banner and the club is grateful that we have such proud, loyal and passionate members who give up their time to ensure that there is a banner for the players to run through at every game at Subiaco Oval and at the Interstate venues. A huge thank you must be given to both the WA Banner Crew, coordinated by Maria Giglia and the Victorian Banner Crew, coordinated by Nicole Hambling.

The club would also like to make special mention of both the WA and Victorian Cheer Squads. The WA Cheer Squad provides a sea of purple at all home games, and, whilst the Victorian Cheer Squad might be outnumbered when we play away, they certainly make up that shortfall in spirit.



GAME DAY AT SUBIACO OVAL

Almost 360,000 supporters attended the 11 home games this season, with an average of just under 33,000 patrons per match. Attendance figures were highlighted by the Round 18 Carlton Mid Derby with a sell-out crowd of 42,096.

The home season kicked off with the ever-popular Starlight Purple Haze Game in Round 2 against Hawthorn and the crowd got into the spirit of dressing purple and digging deep for Starlight.

The success of the annual Len Hall Tribute Game on Anzac Day which was held under lights at Subiaco Oval in Round 6 against Geelong has seen it become a permanent fixture for Fremantle, with the competition and the community acknowledging the match day as an appropriate recognition of the traditions of Australia's armed services.

Also, who could forget Shaun McManus' farewell game against West Coast in Round 18. The tribute after the game was outstanding. His lap of honour to thank his supporters will no doubt be something Shaun will remember forever, as was the guard of honour and being chaired off the ground.

The match day experience for patrons continues to evolve with a raft of match day member events, game day sponsor promotions and pre-match activities. These include curtain raisers for the Fremantle Football Club Youth League and other aligned clubs, the great work done with our aligned charities on game day and, of course, our major game day events such as the Len Hall celebrations.

EVENTS

We started the year off with the 2008 Season Launch at the Burswood Grand Ballroom. Hosted by Tim Gossage, the key note speaker was former Essendon coach Kevin Sheedy. A 600-strong crowd heard about Kevin's early days coaching the Bombers and the path to winning the 1993 premiership with the "Baby Bombers".

More than 1000 people turned out for the Carlton Mid Gala Dinner Auction, which

featured 92.9's Em and Wippa as MCs. Entertainer Andrew Startin delighted guests with his impersonations of Sam Newman, Bruce McAvaney, Richie Benaud and Ian Thorpe. The funds raised from the event are used to support our Community Development Program.

The 2008 Doig Medal Presentation Dinner held at the Burswood Grand Ballroom paid tribute to our seven retiring players, including life members Peter Bell and Shaun McManus. More than 1000 people saw Captain Matthew Pavlich collect a record fifth Doig Medal. The evening was a huge success, with the music of the Royal Australian Navy band filling the dance floor. The evening was topped off by a special guest performance from Shannon Noll.

Other events included the Family Fun Day at Adventure World, as well as the annual Junior Members Christmas Party on Fremantle Oval.

MERCHANDISE

The highlight for the year in this area of operations was the grand opening of our new Team Store at Subiaco Oval located at Gate 13 on Roberts Road.

The grand opening saw Chris Tarrant, Luke McPharlin and Byron Schammer make special appearances at the store with the 92.9 Roadrunners also on hand to provide all the latest hit music and treat shoppers with giveaways.

It is fantastic to finally have a permanent Fremantle presence at the home of football in WA, while at the same time giving members and supporters increased opportunity to purchase the latest fashions and memorabilia from the Team Store.

Both Team Stores and our outlets on match day continued to provide an outstanding range of merchandise and apparel for our members and supporters. There was an increase in demand for memorabilia items, including Rhys Palmer's NAB AFL Rising Star piece and testimonial items for Peter Bell and Shaun McManus.

2008 Club Operations Report

Due to the popularity of Fremantle's showbag last year, numbers had to be doubled for the 2008 Perth Royal Show, with the showbags again proving to be a big hit with show-goers.

IN THE COMMUNITY

Fremantle's commitment to the community reached new heights in 2008 with players making in excess of 590 appearances at community based events and activities. The playing group's participation incorporated the various Fremantle Football Club Community Development Program activities as well as heading to numerous junior football clubs to conduct training sessions, charity events, primary school visits and external community events to name just a few.

COMMUNITY CAMP – SOUTH AFRICA

Fremantle is one of four AFL clubs allocated a game development region within South Africa. The club's North West Province currently has around 3,500 registered participants of Australian Rules football through the junior participation program, FootyWild (South African equivalent to Auskick).

Twenty six players and coaches made the trip to South Africa in late January to further develop the club's relationship with the region and its registered players, but also to gain an insight into the hardships experienced by the locals in one of the most impoverished parts of the world.

Aside from training commitments – which saw the club extend an invitation to 20 talented local players to take part – in the lead up to the exhibition clash with Carlton in Pretoria in early February, Fremantle's travelling party paid visits to the Thakaneng Centre for street kids, the Potchefstroom Regional Correctional Facility as well as making an emotional visit to Cotlands, an orphanage for HIV positive children in Turffontein. The centre receives no government assistance and, before leaving, the club and players made donations to the centre to assist its terrific work for these children. Fremantle's tour of South Africa culminated with a strong 14 point win over the Blues, which was followed by an unusual post match celebration which saw a performance by a Zulu choir, presentations to the players by the children from Cotlands and the players joining the celebrations with children in the crowd.

We thank Nkwe Platinum Limited, Continental Capital Limited and Air Mauritius for their ongoing and valuable support of the club's activities in South Africa.

COMMUNITY CAMP – GREAT SOUTHERN REGION

The club's annual Telstra AFL Community Camp was held in January this year in the Great Southern Region. Based in Albany, the players who made the journey south, including Club Captain Matthew Pavlich, Aaron Sandilands and Luke McPharlin, spent two days in the region and engaged the community through a series of football and non-football events and activities

including a junior skills clinic, sportsman's night and a lawn bowls competition against Middleton Beach Bowls Club. Local 16-18 year old players from the Great Southern Football Academy were also given the rare opportunity to join Fremantle players in a training session at Albany's Centennial Park.

The annual camp was a valuable opportunity for the club to meet its members and supporters in the Great Southern Region and the support that the club received in Albany during this year's camp was fantastic.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM



This year was the fifth year of operation of the club's Community Development Program (CDP) and without question its most successful. The introduction of new programs saw the demand from primary schools around WA to secure places within the CDP increase exponentially. More than 180 schools from around the State took part in at least one CDP activity. All staff and students involved benefited from the experience thanks to our dedicated CDP staff returning to selected schools and community groups on more than one occasion to ensure the CDP values and aims were achieved through repeated meaningful interactions.



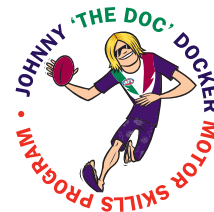
New for 2008, Freo Factor was quick to become one of the most popular programs within the club's CDP, with more than 1,400 students from 32 schools taking part this year. It is a school-based program designed to utilise Fremantle's resources and player expertise to assist students to make informed decisions for a responsible, healthy and active lifestyle.

Freo Factor was one of two new programs introduced to the CDP in 2008, along with Freo Fast Ball, which joined perennial favourites Freo Long Bomb and Freo Kwik Kick to form the Skills4Schools program.

The School Holiday Program again proved a huge success with just over 400 proud, loyal and passionate junior members and supporters enjoying a great day on Fremantle Oval with the players in April.

The Welcome to the AFL program returned for its second year as part of the CDP and was again in high demand. The program is designed to attract and

engage new participants into Australian football, with specific objectives being to introduce culturally and linguistically diverse populations to AFL football and the Fremantle Football Club and also to introduce female participants to the club and the CDP.



The Johnny 'The Doc' Docker Motor Skills Gala Day held in June attracted more than 800 pre-primary students for a fun-filled day of learning with the player group, which culminated their four sessions previously undertaken in the classroom as part of the program.

We thank official Community Development partner Alinta for its ongoing and valuable support of the CDP in 2008.

LIVE THE DREAM

Proudly supported by club sponsor BHP Billiton Iron Ore, the 'Live the Dream' program built on its success in its debut year of 2007 by returning bigger and better. The 2008 program saw the number of participants increased by four to 16, with eight participants venturing south from the Pilbara region to take part.



'Live the Dream' offered these 16-17 year old participants, all of who were viewed as being potential leaders from within their communities, the unique opportunity to develop skills and behaviours that can deliver long term benefits to themselves and their local communities, while also having the chance to live the life of an AFL football player for six days.

The intensive program saw each participant appointed a mentor from the Fremantle player group who guided and assisted them in one-on-one sessions. The player mentors that played a key role throughout the program were Marcus Drum, Paul Duffield, Ryan Murphy, Chris Mayne, Antoni Grover, Michael Johnson, Roger Hayden and Des Headland. Paul Hasleby and Aaron Sandilands also played integral roles in assisting with the co-ordination of the program.

The program included physical conditioning and injury prevention sessions with the club's sports science staff, interactive sessions on nutrition, media training, player welfare and recruitment, senior team match day involvement and post-game recovery and a training session with Player Development Coach Steve Malaxos.

The 16 participants were selected from a large number of community nominations by a panel consisting of Fremantle Football Club staff and BHP Billiton Iron Ore staff. Nominations were sought through BHP Billiton Iron Ore, the Fremantle Football Club Youth League, the City of Fremantle, the Welcome to the AFL program or from the Eastern States Partner Clubs of the Fremantle Football Club.

It is with great excitement that the club will again host this initiative in 2009.

YOUTH LEAGUE

The 2008 Fremantle Football Club Under 17 Youth League, proudly supported by Subway Restaurants, was the fifth year of the competition.

Commencing in mid April and spanning over 100 teams and 4000 participants throughout the Perth metropolitan area and regional centres, the Youth League is seen as the pinnacle of junior football in WA and is a stepping stone for junior footballers to realise their potential of playing WAFL or AFL level football.

Congratulations must go to Fremantle Football Club Under 17 Youth League Premiers Palmyra Junior Football Club (East Fremantle district), Baldivis JFC (Peel district), Jandakot JFC (South Fremantle districts), Bassendean JFC (Swans District), Victoria Park JFC (Perth district), Kingsley Lynx JFC (Subiaco/West Perth/Claremont districts) and Northern Cobras JFC (East Perth district).

PARTNER CLUBS

Fremantle's list of Partner Clubs and schools grew longer in 2008 with the addition of four more clubs, three of which are based in the United Kingdom, taking the total to 39 Partner Clubs and schools around the world.

The Balmain Dockers Women's Football Club came onboard, while the Bristol Dockers, Hartlepoole Dockers and Leith Dockers (all UK based) have helped ensure the purple passion is displayed internationally. Fremantle now has six international Partner Clubs, including the Dublin Dockers (Ireland), Hamburg Dockers (Germany) and Cincinnati Dockers (USA).

Eastern States based Partner Clubs – Doncaster Heights Dockers, Burnie Dockers and Balmain Dockers travelled to Perth in July to undertake a series of events to assist in developing their football and ultimately strengthening their respective relationships with the Fremantle Football Club and each other. Their trip saw the three teams play in a round robin curtain raiser prior to Fremantle's Round 16 win over Melbourne.

Fremantle players and coaches also paid visits to our Eastern States partner clubs in Templestowe (Victoria) and Balmain (NSW) following away games in Melbourne and Sydney, hosting junior clinics and signing autographs.

We thank official club partner Members Equity Bank for its ongoing and valuable support of the program in 2008.

ALIGNED CHARITIES

The club's aligned charities, Redkite and the Heart Foundation of WA, have enjoyed another successful season of partnership as Fremantle's charities of choice.

The partnerships aim to increase awareness of the charities work within the community. The two organisations were chosen from an exceptional field of applicants to become the club's charity partners from seasons 2007 until 2009.

Redkite support children with cancer and offer a range of services to those being treated for cancer and their families, including emotional, financial, educational, and bereavement support, as well as music therapy.

Ryan Crowley and Michael Johnson continued their roles as Redkite Ambassadors and were involved in the Redkite Karaoke Day on ward 3B at Princess Margaret Hospital, as well as visiting the children on the oncology ward at the hospital throughout the year. They also stepped up as quizmasters at the Redkite Corporate Quiz in October.

The Heart Foundation is Australia's leading heart health charity in the fight against heart, stroke and blood vessel disease or cardiovascular disease.

The partnership has seen Fremantle and club sponsor Rick Hart supporting the 'Jump Rope for Heart's 25th Birthday Guinness World Record Jump Off' celebrations.

Heart Foundation Ambassadors Paul Hasleby and Antoni Grover led a group of players, including Dean Solomon, Marcus Drum, Chris Tarrant and Brett Peake to take part in the Guinness World Record attempt with the students at Phoenix Primary School in Spearwood, which was undertaken at various locations across the country on 4 May.

The club's support of its aligned charities is an important part of the Community Goals initiative that sees Fremantle play a role in the Western Australian community.

BRAVERY AWARDS

Fremantle and the South Metropolitan Area Health Service (SMAHS) have developed a lasting relationship through the annual Bravery Awards that have been a key part of the club since 1995.

The 2008 Bravery Awards, proudly sponsored by HBA Health Insurance, recognises the amazing courage and determination of the special children and young adults who pass through the wards of hospitals within the SMAHS. This year the 12 recipients came from Fremantle Hospital, Rockingham/Kwinana District Hospital, Armadale-Kelmscott Memorial Hospital and Royal Perth Hospital.

The awards were presented by some of the club's younger players who form the development group, including Rhys Palmer,

Chris Mayne, Clayton Hinkley, Andrew Foster, Brent Connelly, Luke Pratt, Brock O'Brien and Calib Mourish, with Senior Coach Mark Harvey and Club Captain Matthew Pavlich also on hand to assist with the presentations.

The development players introduced each of the award recipients and detailed their outstanding stories of bravery and strength during their hospitalisation, particularly acknowledging the often long recovery process some have faced and still face today.

This year's recipients were: Scott Joyce, of Mosman Park; Ethan Lynam, of Kelmscott; Sophie Lawson, of Kardinya; William Valentino, of Clarkson; Joshua Martin, of Port Kennedy; Hazim Darwish, of Kelmscott; Alec Thomas, of Mandurah; Rumon Oswald-Kok, of Pinjarra; Taghi Rezai, of Spearwood; Rebecca Stanley, of Canningvale and Sam Hurst, of Attadale.

STARLIGHT PURPLE HAZE GAME

The annual Starlight Purple Haze Game, proudly supported by Fremantle Ports, has become an iconic game for the club to start the home and away season. Season 2009 will see Fremantle again kick off the home and away fixtures with the Starlight Purple Haze Game scheduled for Round 1 v Western Bulldogs at Subiaco Oval.

The annual event raises money for the Starlight Children's Foundation and has, since its inception in 2003, raised almost \$200,000 for Starlight to help seriously ill and hospitalised children in Western Australia. This year's game against Hawthorn in Round 2 set a new game day fundraising record of \$40,624.30.

The generosity of members and supporters on game day this year has granted five wishes to seriously ill children in Western Australia with \$15,000 going to the Starlight Escapes Program, an initiative that brings together families and children to enjoy a special day of fun and excitement.

The Purple Haze Ambassadors, Des Headland, Chris Tarrant, Ryan Murphy and Aaron Sandilands, again spent time visiting children in the Starlight Express Rooms at hospitals across Perth to lift their spirits and bring smiles to the faces of all the children.

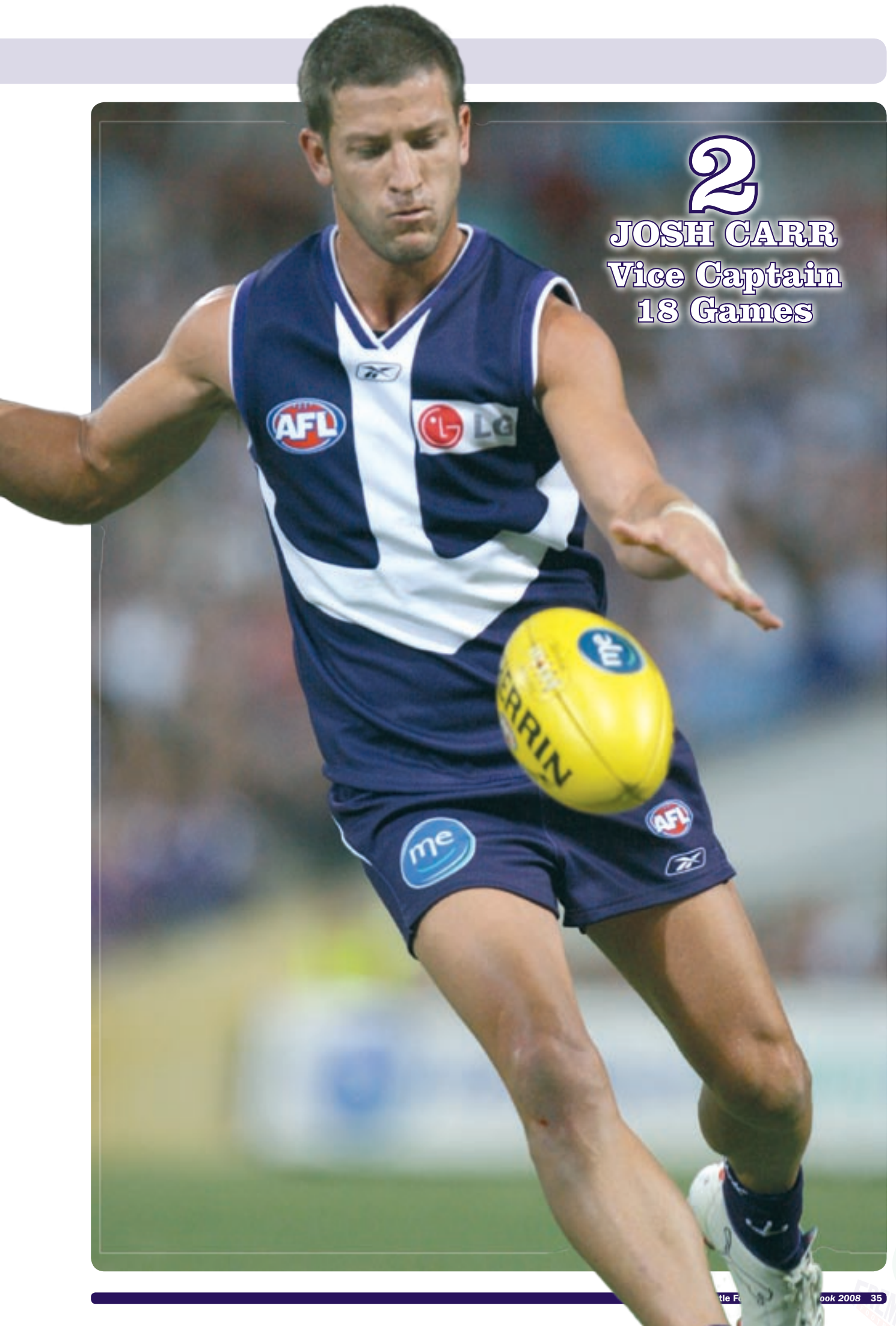

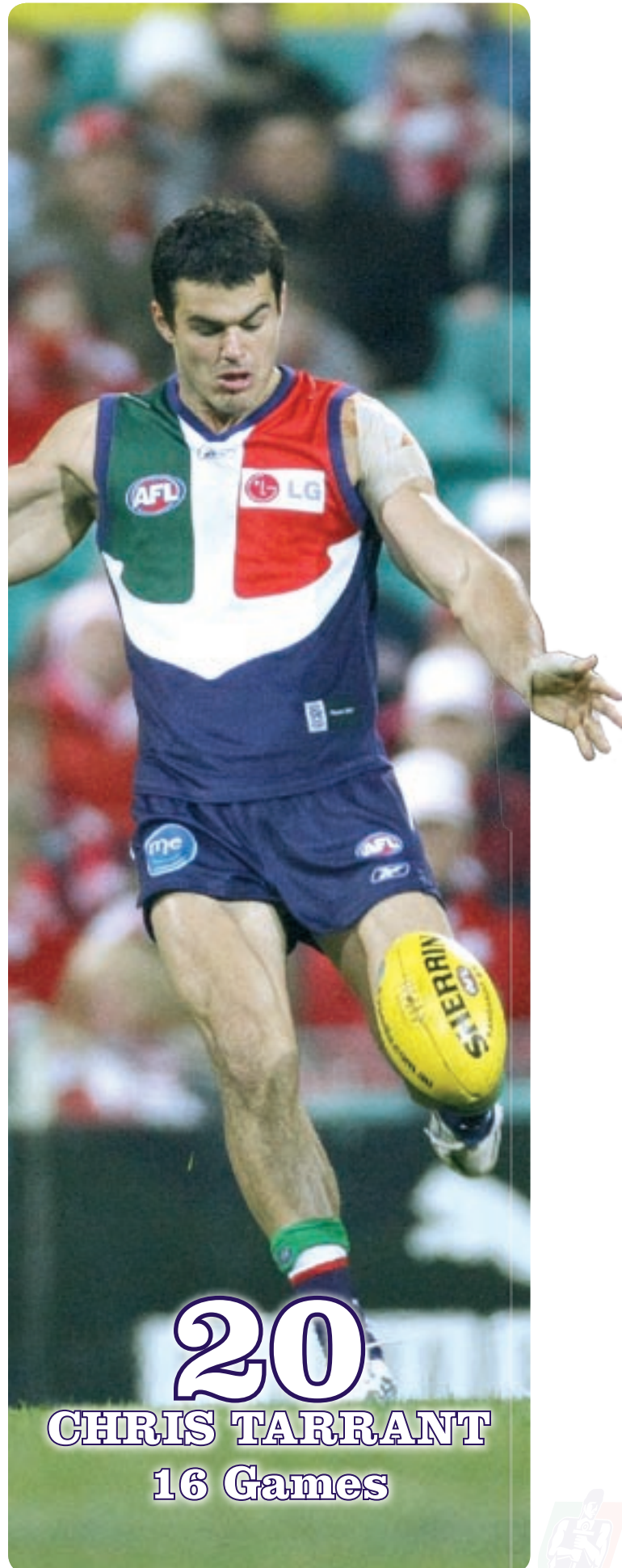

Farewells

PETER BELL

– Retirement

Peter's career saw him establish himself as arguably the finest player to wear the Fremantle Football Club jumper and one of the greatest players ever produced in WA. Peter brought down the curtain on a stellar 286-game career after Round 14 this season, and he finished in style with 20 disposals and a career high 11 tackles.

Born in Korea and raised in Kojoonup, Peter's career is arguably one of football's greatest ever stories. Following his debut for Fremantle in Round 1, 1995 he went on to forge a career that delivered success on both a personal and team level.

A dual premiership player with North Melbourne in 1996 and 1999, Peter returned to Fremantle in 2001 and captained the club from 2002 to 2006.

During his 14-year career, the 32-year-old twice won All Australian selection and is a three time Doig Medal winner. Peter was also runner-up in the Doig Medal three times.

A former president of the AFL Players Association, Peter is a Life Member of both the Fremantle Football Club and the AFL.

Despite standing only 175cm in height, Peter's impact on the game cannot be understated. His football and athletic ability were under-rated but he combined consistency, enormous courage and great leadership to be a genuine champion of the game and of the Fremantle Football Club.



SHAUN McMANUS

– Retirement

Round 18 saw the curtain come down on the career of the 'heart of soul' of the club when veteran and inaugural squad member Shaun McManus announced his retirement after 228 AFL matches.

The decision to end his career following the Round 18 Carlton Mid Derby, the 22nd Derby he appeared in, brought to a close a career that stretched back 14 seasons to 1995 when he played his first match against Footscray in Round 5 of the club's AFL debut year.

Shaun's career was one built on courage, passion, commitment, sheer hard work and a steely resolve to overcome adversity.

Two career threatening anterior cruciate ligament injuries and the reconstructive surgery that followed had the gritty midfielder questioning his future in 1997 and 1998, as did his stretch with East Fremantle in the WAFL in 2005.

But when it would have been all too easy to give it away, Shaun put his head down and did what he has always done best, working his way back into Fremantle's starting 22.

He entered 2007 on the back of arguably his best season in the AFL, playing a key role in the club's push to the Preliminary Final in 2006.

Shaun was one of just five players to play in each of Fremantle's 22 matches in 2007, more than justifying the club's offer for him to play on in 2008 to become the club's longest serving player with 14 years service at Fremantle.



JEFF FARMER

– Retirement

Jeff's record of 483 career goals is the most kicked by an Indigenous player in the history of the VFL/AFL, while his tally of 224 goals for Fremantle ranks him second in the club's all time goal kicking records.

Fondly adored by faithful fans as 'the Wiz', Jeff made a name for himself throughout his 14 year career as a dangerous goal sneak capable of executing freakishly accurate displays in front of goal.

Born and bred in Tambellup, he burst onto the AFL scene with Melbourne in 1995 and he played seven games in his debut season. The following year he earned himself a Rising Star nomination and was also named as one of the finalists for Goal of the Year.

His 55 goals in 2006 were a big reason behind Fremantle's rise to its first ever Preliminary Final and were the most he had kicked in a season since coming to Fremantle at the end of 2001, and the most since his All Australian season of 2000 when he booted 76 for the year.

From the day he pulled on a Fremantle jumper until his last game in Round 22, Jeff provided Fremantle supporters with incredible moments of excitement, and his crowd-pleasing antics will be remembered for a long time to come.



HEATH BLACK

– Retirement

Heath retired from football after 192 AFL games and 11 seasons (138 matches for Fremantle and 54 for St Kilda between 1997 and 2008).

A skilful and damaging left footer, Heath's tenacity and ability to break the lines saw him forge a career as one of our most reliable sweeping defenders.

Taken with Fremantle's first selection (no. 12 overall) in the 1996 National Draft, Heath played 15 games in his debut season and earned an AFL Rising Star nomination.

After finishing runner-up to Peter Bell in the 2001 Doig Medal, Heath headed back to Victoria to play with St Kilda. He spent three seasons at Moorabbin, playing finals football in his last year with the Saints. He sought to be traded back to Fremantle at the end of 2004 and had his wish granted.

He played every game in his first season back at Fremantle, leading the team for most kicks, and in 2006 he played 24 out of a possible 25 games to help steer the club into the finals for the second time, including a Preliminary Final.

His endeavours around the club on and off the field earned him the 2007 Best Clubman Award.



MATTHEW CARR

– Retirement

Matthew played 134 matches for Fremantle between 2001 and 2008 after playing 28 matches for St Kilda between 1999 and 2000.

He began his AFL career with the Saints, where he was taken with their first selection (7th overall) in the 1998 Pre-Season Draft. After two seasons in Melbourne he returned to his native Western Australia and immediately proved a terrific acquisition for Fremantle, leading the club for kicks and marks in his first season and performing a variety of roles.

He continued to display outstanding form for the club and was rewarded with selection in the Australian team for the 2003 International Rules series. That same year he was also named in WA's State of Origin team.

Injuries restricted him to just 20 games in 2004 and 2005 but he returned in 2006 to play all 22 home and away games and three finals matches and was an important part of Fremantle's most successful season.

Matthew announced his retirement from football mid-season, simply stating that he knew the time had come but that the honour associated with representing the Fremantle Football Club would not be soon forgotten.



MARK JOHNSON

– Retirement

Mark may have only been at Fremantle for one year but the positive impact he had on the club, in the final year of his career, will not be forgotten quickly.

For those that had the opportunity to work with Mark, they'd describe him as a first-rate individual who made an immediate impact on everyone at the club when he arrived late last year.

He had a team-first approach and an infectious passion for the game that inspired those around him to work harder.

With a career spanning 10 years and 200-plus games, including a premiership, you'd expect nothing less from a champion of his ilk.

Renowned for his fearless attack on the ball and unwavering work ethic, Mark shaped a career as an ardent in and under ball winner, prepared to put his body on the line to gain possession.

Mark etched his name into the 200 Club history books in Round 14 when he ironically came up against his former club Essendon for his milestone match.

He played 14 games in 2008 and on hanging up his boots, he thanked Fremantle for giving him positive closure on his career.



LUKE WEBSTER

– Retirement

Luke's reel of highlights in his 33 game AFL career with Fremantle holds as many memorable moments as players who have reached triple figures in their career games count.

The 26 year old was amongst Fremantle's best players in its historic first final against Essendon in 2003 as well lining up in the club's Semi-Final and Preliminary Final in 2006.

He was also the reason Shaun McManus got to celebrate his 200th AFL match with a win in Round 5, 2007. In a low scoring, rain effected affair at Subiaco Oval against Adelaide, Luke snapped the match winning point late in the game to ensure Fremantle scraped home by the barest of margins to give Shaun a fairytale result in his milestone match.

A popular and respected member of the Fremantle playing group, Luke took out the Best Clubman award in 2006 and again in 2008.

His commitment to the club is what absolved him of any disappointment associated with stepping away from football when he announced his intentions in August after six seasons with Fremantle.

Ever the selfless clubman, Luke's decision was made to allow the club's exciting up and coming young guns the opportunity to develop further and reach the highest level quicker to help the club begin its quest for sustained success.



JOSH CARR

Josh moved to Fremantle from Port Adelaide to join brother Matthew for the 2005 season.

He came with the reputation as one of the most tenacious players in the AFL. Josh's leadership, hardness, and ball-winning ability have been hallmarks throughout his career and he was awarded Fremantle's vice captaincy for the 2007 and 2008 seasons. His solid performances for Fremantle also saw him earn State of Origin selections in 2006 and 2007.



RYLEY DUNN

Ryley was taken with the club's first selection (number 10 overall) in the 2003 National Draft after twice receiving All Australian status following the National Under 18's championships. Ryley made his debut in Round 1, 2004 against Carlton at Subiaco Oval. He played eight AFL games over five seasons but his career was hampered by continual injuries.



ROBERT WARNOCK

Robert was taken by Fremantle with its third selection (number 42 overall) in the 2005 National Draft. He made his AFL debut against Brisbane in Round 6, 2007. It was the first of 12 appearances that year, which was capped off with the club's Beacon Award. Season 2008 saw him make nine appearances for the club with the balance of his games being played in the seniors for West Perth in the WAFL.



CHRIS SMITH

Chris is a tough and versatile player from Queensland who was selected in the 2006 Rookie Draft. He spent the 2007 season developing his game further with Swan Districts in the WAFL, playing as a midfielder and forward. This season saw him continue to play mostly seniors with the Swans, which included a spot in the 2008 WAFL Grand Final side that took on Subiaco.



CALIB MOURISH

Originally from Geraldton, Calib was selected in the 2006 NAB AFL Draft (number 77 overall). A product of the Clontarf Academy in Geraldton, he was involved with East Fremantle's country development squads before being drafted. He joined the rookie list this season where he spent the year playing at East Fremantle in the WAFL.
